"Remembering How Important Moms Are"

Life is a series of seasons. During challenging seasons—from unique phases of life and rites of passage to the days surrounding deeply meaningful occasions like Mother's Day or birthdays—it is not uncommon to wonder about our purpose in life or even question it if we ever knew what it was. As a child, you can remember being asked to draw a picture of what you wanted to be when you grew up. It seemed so simple back then to dream up anything and just run with it, but somehow as we grow older we can be filled with doubt or insecurity in the roles we are in. **We end up questioning if we are where we're supposed to be.**

The story of Queen Esther in the Bible. Here there is a young girl who suddenly found herself in a role she never expected. She first finds favor with the king, but suddenly he begins to withdraw (*talk about feeling insecure!*). In the most critical hour, she feels powerless and unqualified. Sometimes, in those challenging seasons, we can also feel that way in our roles as women. Remember feeling unqualified or unprepared as a freshman in college? How about in a first job? Or the first week as a mom?

Many of us are familiar with the sentiments from the story in Esther 4:14 - *Perhaps this is the moment for which you have been created*—this is God's purpose for you. This encouraging truth is applicable in so many of our roles as women. Whenever we feel inadequate or unqualified, we must remember that **God will prepare us and position us in the calling He has for our life**. He will also equip us with everything we need to fulfill the destiny He has for us.

So much of our walk with God is spent in preparation and waiting. It might look like waiting for a big break in a job, seeing the kids grow up and go to college, or taking a step of faith and pursuing a forgotten dream. During these times, it can be difficult to understand God's ways and plans for our lives. We might wonder: *Is my life leading to something great? Will I make it through another day? Why am I going through all of this?* We must always remember that God has a purpose for us and is the Master at working all things together for our good and His. He is working out details behind the scenes to prepare us for the calling He has for our lives.

Perhaps, like most of us, you find yourself questioning God's calling in your life. Whether you're going to work every day, volunteering at church, changing diapers, washing dishes, brushing tiny teeth, or any combination of these, here are three truths from Esther's life to remember:


1. You were CREATED by an awesome God for a powerful purpose.


Living Word News

FEELING POT LUCKY?? Hopefully as soon as the stay at home order is lifted and we start to gather for worship on a more regular basis, we will want to start looking forward to fellowship events and summertime fun. The idea is already being kicked around slightly. Of course our main goal is everyone's safety, but we just thought that it would be really nice to have something to get excited about and to able to have plenty of time to start planning. We will, of course want to have some type of dedication ceremony for our brand new floor and we will honor Ruth Grebik for her very generous bequest at that time as well. So while everyone is bored at home, go through your cookbooks and recipes and think about what you are able to contribute, you know how hungry we all must be for not being able to have a grand spread all this while. LOL.

JUNE SERVICES are tentatively being planned to start as of June 7th. This will only be a "soft opening" as we will restrict it at the start for 10 couples, individuals and/or families. This will of course depend on the situation at that time. As long as our governor will keep the stay at home order in place, we will honor that. However, it appears that this should be lifted at the start of June and we would like to gather at least partially, so this will be on a sign up basis only for the first week or so at first. You can sign up for different Sundays depending on your choice and as to what is available. The Sunday dates for the month of June are 7th, 14th, 21st and the 28th. We will practice the social distancing rule of 6', so families, individuals and/or couples will be seated as such. The 7th and the 21st will be communion Sunday and Diana Motel has already ordered prepacked individual servings of the communion wine and wafers from Concordia to help keep all of our members safe. If need be and if you prefer to wear a mask, that will help as well. Please call the office or send me an email to sign up for a particular Sunday worship. It will be a first come first serve basis and we will try to accommodate everyone within that first couple of weeks depending on your preferences. As time gets closer, I will be calling everyone as well to go over all the details. Worship time will still be 9:30 AM and hopefully we can increase the number gradually depending on circumstances. Most importantly we want to keep all of our members safe and to keep them healthy. We want to thank you deeply for all your patience and understanding during this very difficult time. We are hoping to be able to increase the number progressively as the month goes on and as we adhere to the phases of the reopening schedule mandated by Governor Pritzker. Just to reassure everyone as well, there is a very intensive and deep cleaning taking place currently and being planned for the coming weeks, the floor installers have completed the floor, and sent in a cleaning crew last week to start the clean up process, I have started a deep clean of all areas, items and surfaces in every room of the building. We are having each room painted, once the walls have been cleaned and washed several times. Plus we still have hand sanitizer available here and the building will be disinfected prior to our first service. Please call with any questions, concerns, comments or suggestions. We need everyone's help to insure we don't forget anyone's needs. Thank you all.

PAINTING THIS WEEK, the two classrooms are getting a new fresh coat of paint. Gary Pote has been busy this week in the Nature Exploration Academy room. He has wiped down the walls and taped everything and has started cutting and painting the walls. He plans on doing the same for the preschool room next week. Thanks Gary! While those two rooms are getting painted, Bill Merchantz and Jim McKinney have been painting the kitchen. Thanks Bill and Jim!! We are going to have such a great looking church to come back to once all of this stay at home order will finally be lifted.

If more than a couple people volunteer, they can be done separately to ensure that everyone stays safe and healthy.
