# "Getting Ready To Reopen"

As we are preparing for reconvening for worship, the following guidelines from the Illinois Department of Public Health and we encourage all our members to be aware of the risks and follow recommendations.

#### Know the systems:

Symptoms Clinical features are fever or signs/symptoms of lower respiratory illnesses. Symptoms may include:

- •Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- •Human coronaviruses can sometimes cause lower-respiratory tract illnesses, such as pneumonia or bronchitis.

If you are experiencing any of these symptoms, we ask that you stay home and enjoy our online worship opportunity.

If you are attending worship, Please take your temperature before leaving home.

The following can help prevent the spread of coronaviruses and protect yourself and your fellow members from becoming infected:

- •wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds;
- •avoid touching eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands;
- •avoid close contact with people who are sick.

In addition, we will be avoiding shaking hands as a social greeting

**JUNE SERVICES** are tentatively being planned to start as of Saturday, June 6th. We will be doing services on Saturdays in the beginning so that the services will be able to get posted to the website and Facebook page. This will only be a "soft opening" as we will restrict it at the start for 10 individuals in the entire building. This will of course depend on the situation at that time. As long as our governor will keep the stay at home order in place, we will honor that. However, it appears that this should be lifted at the start of June hopefully, and we would like to gather at least partially, so this will be on a sign up basis only for the first week or so at first. You can sign up for different Saturdays depending on your choice and as to what is available. The Saturday dates for the month of June are 6th, 13th, 20th and the 27th. We will practice the social distancing rule of 6', and we will be seated as such. This includes Pastor Lee and Elaine, Anita and a tech booth person. The 6th and the 20th will be communion, and Diana Motel has already ordered pre-packed individual servings of the communion wine and wafers from Concordia to help keep all of our members safe. If need be and if you prefer to wear a mask, that will help as well. Please call the office or send me an email to sign up for a particular Saturday worship. It will be a first come first serve basis and we will try to accommodate everyone within that first couple of weeks depending on your preferences. As time gets closer, I will be calling everyone as well to go over all the details. Worship time will be 9:00 AM and hopefully we can increase the number gradually depending on circumstances. Most importantly we want to keep all of our members safe and to keep them healthy. We want to thank you deeply for all your patience and understanding during this very difficult time. We are hoping to be able to increase the number progressively as the month goes on and as we adhere to the phases of the reopening schedule mandated by Governor Pritzker. Just to reassure everyone as well, there is a very intensive and deep cleaning taking place currently and being planned for the coming weeks, the floor installers have completed the floor, and sent in a cleaning crew last week to start the clean up process, we have started a deep clean of all areas, items and surfaces in every room and cabinet of the building. We are having each room painted, once the walls have been cleaned and washed several times. Plus we still have hand sanitizer available here and the building will be disinfected prior to our first service. Please call with any questions, concerns, comments or suggestions. We need everyone's help to insure we don't forget anyone's needs. Thank you all.

This program not only helps low income families and children, but it **also provides meaningful work for our adult participants with disabilities**. They too have been side-lined by this pandemic and are anxious to get back to work. In addition, the wide-spread unemployment in the communities we serve has only increased the demand for school supply assistance for this upcoming school year.

It is their goal and desire to help as many under-resourced families as we can and provide meaningful work for our adults. At this time they plan to build approximately 11,000 kits which will be distributed to the communities with the most significant need. To do so, they need the partnership of local churches like ours who also desire to make a life-changing difference for children and families in need.

HOPE Packs are packs of school supplies provided to students to give them the tools they need to have a productive and successful school year. These packs include pencils, folders, notebooks, glue, markers, erasers, scissors, and more! They are carefully assembled by Elim's adults and distributed to schools and ministries in the Chicagoland area.

#### Who is impacted?

By supporting HOPE Packs, you are supporting two individuals: Our partnership blesses an Elim adult with meaningful work AND provides essential school supplies to a child not far from your own community. You make a life-long impact on both of their lives.



#### What happens with the HOPE Packs donations?
