"Peace Is A Choice"

I found this article online when researching for current events, and I thought after everything that has been happening, this article is perfect for today.

"If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peaceably with all men." Romans 12:18

It's not always possible, because not all want to live peaceably with us. But we are counseled to do everything we can to be at peace, regardless. Many times this will require us to allow the other person to be wrong and not argue with them. Preserve their dignity. Human nature wants to assert what we know to be right, but wisdom speaks louder and oftentimes tells us to be quiet. It can diffuse many a volatile situation. And if we do it with a smile, it can totally disarm our adversary.

However, if someone insists on not being at peace with you and lashes out, always remember, "WWJD" – what would Jesus do? He gave us many an example of this, and sometimes he simply walked away. But what if you can't even do that? What if you can't walk away? Then we are called to turn the situation over to the Lord and submit it to him, letting it go into his capable hands. He tells us in a situation like that that we are to refuse to take vengeance. Yes, we will feel the stings of anger and hurt feelings, and he says not to try to squelch that. Deal with it. Give place to it BEFORE THE LORD. Tell him all about it. Express your frustration and anger and bitterness to him. He'll listen, he's the lover of your soul. But then …let it go. You've given place to it, you've expressed it, now let it go. Don't go over it again and again and again, don't dwell on it, let it go. If you do it HIS way, he will take care of it, never doubt that. Your job is to stay in his peace. vs 19:

"Beloved, do not avenge yourselves, but rather give place to wrath; for it is written, 'Vengeance is mine, I will repay,' says the Lord.""

Friends, it's not easy and the Lord never said it would be. But we are channels of his love if we will allow ourselves to be that. And you just never know what love can accomplish. It can so disarm your enemy that the Lord can then bring him to repentance. So always take the high ground, for you never know what the Lord is up to behind the scenes.

vs 20:

"Therefore, 'If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him a drink; for in so doing you will heap coals of fire on his head.""

If we strive to remain in the love of God and do all we can to live peaceably with all, our hearts will remain free. There is nothing, absolutely nothing, like walking in the peace of God and knowing the awareness of his presence continually. Anyone who has known it would never even think to go back to walking in hateful feelings, oh how repulsive is even the thought. Let us therefore keep an eye always on the possibility of seeing things turn for the good even in the lives of our adversaries. And there's only one way to get there:

vs 21:

"Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good."

Know the systems:

Symptoms Clinical features are fever or signs/symptoms of lower respiratory illnesses. Symptoms may include:

- •Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- •Human coronaviruses can sometimes cause lower-respiratory tract illnesses, such as pneumonia or bronchitis.

If you are experiencing any of these symptoms, we ask that you stay home and enjoy our online worship opportunity.

The following can help prevent the spread of coronaviruses and protect yourself and your fellow members from becoming infected:

- •wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds;

September Mission of The Month and Special Service



"God's Grace at Ground Zero" 9/11 Memorial Event

On Sunday, September 13, at our 10 a.m. service, 9/11 chaplain and Living Word Pastor Steve Lee will give a special 9/11 anniversary presentation, "God's Grace at Ground Zero." A former California sheriff's sergeant and NCIS special agent, Pastor Lee served as Ground Zero Cross recovery crew chaplain (now preserved as part of the permanent 9/11 Memorial Museum). In addition to showing pictures of Ground Zero and the cross recovery, he will relate experiences working with first responders and recovery workers in the days following 9/11. As part of this "Mission of the Month" presentation, he will also share future publishing plans for a special law enforcement "officer survival" edition Bible.

In addition to serving in New York after 9/11, Pastor Lee has served as on-scene chaplain at major crises and disasters such as the Columbine High School shooting, Hurricane Katrina, the Haiti earthquake, and more recent events such as the Las Vegas Mandalay Bay Hotel shooting.

We want to recognize, honor, and support all our first responders—police, fire, and EMS—who risk so much to protect and serve us all. God bless you, and may God bless America!
