"Created and Redeemed"

Psalm 95:3-6 - For the LORD is a great God, and a great King above all gods. In His hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are His also. The sea is His, for He made it, and His hands formed the dry land. Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the LORD, our Maker!

The gods and goddesses of many religions make their claims on the world. Many people believe that the stars and planets control human destiny, a false claim that gives a god-like status to the created heavenly bodies. Even the earth itself is sometimes described as a goddess, personified as "Mother Nature" or "Mother Earth." Those who believe these false ideas have "exchanged the truth about God for a lie and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator" (Romans 1:25a).

These other "gods" have no true claim on the earth or any part of creation. The Triune God alone is God. As Scripture reminds us, "The gods of the peoples are worthless idols, but the LORD made the heavens" (1 Chronicles 16:26). We are not to worship creation, but to acknowledge its Creator and worship Him alone. From the deepest valleys and ocean depths to the highest mountains, the earth belongs to the Lord because He created it all. At His command, "the mountains rose, the valleys sank down" (Psalm 104:8a). God gave the care of His creation to the human beings He created, telling them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth" (Genesis 1:28b).

The people into whose care God first placed His creation willfully plunged themselves and the world into the darkness of sin and death. Yet our great God and King still loved the world He created and sent His Son to be its Savior. Jesus took onto Himself the burden of this world's sin and suffered the penalty of death for our rebellion against our Creator. No other "god" has done that! Jesus rose in triumph over death on the first Easter morning. By God's grace, through faith in Jesus, our sins are swept away in the Savior's blood. Jesus, through whom and for whom all things were created, now reigns in exalted glory. He shares no dominion with idols; all authority in heaven and on earth have been given to Him. On a great day still to come, Jesus our Lord will return in glory as King and Judge. This present earth will pass away, and God will create a new heaven and a new earth, making all things new.

Our Creator and Savior holds in His hand the deepest places of the earth and the highest mountains. He holds *us* in His hand! By the power of the Holy Spirit, there is only one response that we can make: "Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the LORD, our Maker!"

"Letter from Northern Illinois District"

A Statement on Tier 3 Mitigation Measures

Dear Pastors and Congregational Chairs,

Last week, I issued a statement, assuring you that your NID staff would continue to monitor state agencies for updates on mitigation measures that are being set in place by Governor Pritzker in an attempt to keep the public safe in the midst of this pandemic. On November 17, in response to the record-high Covid-19 positivity rates currently being experienced in Illinois, Governor Pritzker issued new mitigations, moving the entire state to the more-restrictive, Tier 3 measures. These measures at to take effect on Friday, November 20.

So that you may be informed as to what is going on in your communities as a result of these new measures, you are encouraged to go to the state of Illinois' website and read the Tier 3 orders as well as the Illinois Department of Public Health's six-page report on houses of worship: www.dph.illinois.gov/covid19/community-guidance/places-worship-guidance. As our NID staff has reviewed these documents the following may be most significant to your congregation:

- 1. The State is highly encouraging churches to follow the Tier 3 mitigation measures for occupancy restrictions and social gatherings wherever possible.
- 2. For Word and Sacrament worship services, these mitigation measures are recommendations, not mandates. Please keep up good and holy work as you provide God's Word and sacrament to congregations. Thank you also for not forgetting your faithful witness to your community.
- 3. Other activities that take place outside of worship services [such as potlucks, group Bible studies, board meetings, etc.] should follow the Tier 3 mitigation measures.
- 4. The state has specifically cited weddings and funerals as falling under the Tier 3 mitigation measures. Please check with your local health department officials for specific questions related to this.
- 5. Where in-person worship does take place, churches are always encouraged to follow the physical and social distancing guidelines as set forth by the Illinois Department of Public Health.

We are heartened to hear how pastors and laity are working together to bring Christ-like care to all in the midst of this crisis. If there's any way we at the NID office may be of service to you, please reach out to us.

We continually lift you up in prayer at the NID office, giving thanks to our Lord for your faithful service, and asking Him to continue to shield you from harm as you bring the gift of His compassionate mercy and the hope of salvation in Christ to the communities you serve. May we be blessed by and reflective of our Lord's encouragement in I Corinthians 15:58. "Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

We will continue to stay up to date on any new measures our state may take to combat this pandemic, and we will continue to keep you informed. We are in this together, and the Almighty Lord is with us all!

A Letter from Pastor Lee

Dear Nature Exploration Academy Parents,

As you may already know, I have begun visiting with your students on a weekly basis to present what I call, "The Laws of Nature and of Nature's God." This presentation combines the educational philosophy of the Nature Academy—including broad Christian principles—with natural law and civil government, here articulated by our nation's founders in the stirring words of our precious Declaration of Independence:

"When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which **the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God** entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation."

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.--That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed..."

As current vacancy pastor of Living Word Lutheran Church, my role is to provide transitional leadership moving ahead to our next developmental step. As part of this process, we are exploring initiatives that provide service to our community. I believe there is no better opportunity for doing so than partnership with our preschool and the Nature Academy, in part because we already host these two ministries on our campus. But even more importantly we must do everything in our power to educate and equip our precious children to strengthen them for success in their "pursuit of happiness." I am sure you agree that a solid grounding in classic Christianity and American civic principle is essential.
