# "Rejoice, Pray and Give Thanks"

"Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 (NIV)

The presents are opened, the Christmas decorations are put away and the New Year's resolutions have been made. Let's now sit back and take in the beauty of our lives as we welcome in the New Year.

The scripture that has been chosen for the sermon and this newsletter is for the purpose of encouragement to you and is comprised of three short verses containing a total of 18 words yet their impact is profound! They are standalone calls to action, which are connected together, have a dependence upon one another and are of great importance to every believer. These three exhortations provide direction and encouragement as we walk the path God has charted for our lives.

#### **REJOICE ALWAYS.**

Each child of God should rejoice in all that He has provided us for it is the Lord who is the Author of every perfect gift from above. We often need to stand in awe in what our Redeemer has given us. Yes, we all have suffered adversity and tough times through the years, but He has never failed us—and in that we should rejoice!

Ultimately, we should rejoice in God for it is in Him that our joy will be full. No matter what life encounters we experience we can still rejoice in our Redeemer who never changes and never forsakes us. We may have sorrowful moments, yet we rejoice always; we may lack, yet through our rejoicing we are made rich— we may even have nothing, yet in rejoicing—we possess everything! (2 Corinthians 6:10) The life of a Christian is a contented life for it is a life of constant joy no matter the circumstances.

#### PRAY ALWAYS.

People of Christ need to declare this truth, "Some prayer, some power; more prayer, more power; much prayer, much power!" And prayer yields the same results for joy— "Some prayer, some joy; more prayer, more joy; much prayer, much joy!"

Children of God should pray a prayer of thanksgiving the moment we awake and pray through the day until our prayers culminate in praise by days end. #### **GIVE THANKS ALWAYS.**

Prayer is the gateway to the Father and thanksgiving is the key that opens the door. If we pray without ceasing then we should give thanks in everything. We should be thankful in every condition—in adversity as well as in prosperity. We should rejoice in the life we have been afforded—giving thanks for the years past, righteously living each day as if it were our last and planning as if we had a hundred years more.

We have all prayed the Lord's Prayer and recited the phrase, "Thy will be done..." I ask, "Who among us doesn't want to please our Father in Heaven?" Therefore, in obedience to His will, we are encouraged to offer a sacrifice of praise to the Lord with a voice of thanksgiving and glorify His Holy Name for He is good and His mercy endures forever.

I will end this newsletter article to you with the blessing the Apostle Paul gave to the people of Thessalonica. He declares these words over my life and yours for this very trying year of 2020, and in hopes that we all will have a safer and a more blessed year in 2021.

"Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you through and through, that is, separate you from profane and vulgar things, make you pure and whole and undamaged—consecrated to Him— set apart for His purpose; and may your spirit and soul and body be kept complete and be found blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Faithful and absolutely trustworthy is He who is calling you to Himself for your salvation, and He will do it, He will fulfill His call by making you holy, guarding you, watching over you, and protecting you as His own." (I Thessalonians 5:23-24)

God desires that His children live the abundant life of the believer— He wants us to rejoice always, pray always and give thanks always—it is pleasing to Him.

# 12/13/2020 Message Outline

### "Rejoice!"

Psalm 126 says: "When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dreamed. Our mouths were filled with laughter, our tongues with songs of joy." In Christ we are restored and rejoice...!

### 1) I rejoice in God the Father's HEALING!

The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is on me, because the Lord has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, <sup>2</sup> to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, <sup>3</sup> and provide for those who grieve in Zion—to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair.

Isaiah 61:1-3a

### 2) I rejoice in God the Son's HELP!

<sup>16</sup> Rejoice always, <sup>17</sup> pray continually, <sup>18</sup> give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. <sup>19</sup> Do not quench the Spirit. <sup>20</sup> Do not treat prophecies with contempt <sup>21</sup> but test them all; hold on to what is good, <sup>22</sup> reject every kind of evil. <sup>23</sup> May God himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through. May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

## 3) I rejoice in God the Holy Spirit's HOPE!

<sup>19</sup> Now this was John's testimony when the Jewish leaders in Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him who he was. <sup>20</sup> He did not fail to confess, but confessed freely, "I am not the Messiah." <sup>21</sup> They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." <sup>22</sup> Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" <sup>23</sup> John replied in the words of Isaiah the prophet, "I am the voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.'" <sup>24</sup> Now the Pharisees who had been sent <sup>25</sup> questioned him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" <sup>26</sup> "I baptize with water," John replied, "but among you stands one you do not know. <sup>27</sup> He is the one who comes after me, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie."
