"Comfort for God's People"

Whether we are reading the daily paper, listening to the radio, or watching TV, the news is filled with what one might call the fruits of discouragement and even despair. Life is like a continuous newsreel showing the futile actions of people trying to live without a biblical hope, one solidly fixed on God as their defense and refuge.

Without question, we live in a strife-ridden world, one torn by wars, by famine, by disease and sickness, by natural disasters of gigantic proportion, by injustices and corrupt governments run by self-seeking politicians who are like capricious children (Isa. 3:4). But what is even worse, they rule over a populace that by-in-large has become indifferent to the moral improprieties in its leaders. Ours is a world polluted by demonic powers and humanistic ideas where man is wise in his own eyes and clever in his own sight. Through this satanically-inspired, man-made wisdom, man perverts and distorts what is good and wholesome, and in the process, takes people further and further away from God. As it was in Isaiah's day, evil is called good, and good evil, darkness is substituted for light and light for darkness, bitter is substituted for sweet and sweet for bitter (Isa. 5:20). The root of the problem is that we have become wise in our own eyes and clever in our own sight (Isa. 5:21) for we now live in a day where we have not only taken prayer out of the schools, but where it is against the law for a teacher or even a judge to have a copy of the Ten Commandments in their class or courtroom.

In the first chapters of Isaiah, the prophet graphically portrays this whole scenario when man rejects God's revelation and turns to his own cleverness. Had there been a *Jerusalem Gazette* in Isaiah's day, I would imagine its front page was not greatly different from the front pages of our newspapers today.

Certainly, ours is a day that needs to hear Isaiah's cry where he sarcastically addresses the rulers in Jerusalem (the capital) and the people of the nation, Israel: "Hear the word of the Lord, You rulers of Sodom; Give ear to the instruction of our God, You people of Gomorrah" (Isa. 1:10).

Sadly and ironically Isaiah's day, as with our day, was also a day of great religiosity. Daily events demonstrate two things in America today:

- (1) The restless and yet futile activity of a world full of people who know not the comfort of God because they refuse to live under the shelter of the Most High so that they might enjoy the shadow (the comfort and protection) of the Almighty.
- (2) The tragic results of man's choice to ignore God's shelter. The result is a society that, in its mad pursuit to find meaning and happiness without God, is bombarded by spiritual, social, and moral decay. Isaiah portrays this as the constant churning of a restless sea with its waves constantly buffeting the shore and casting up mire and mud. What a graphic picture of the moral pollution that covers society.

"God's Christmas Kiss"

What are the ghosts in your life? Psalm 85:10 says: "Love and faithfulness meet together; righteousness and peace kiss each other." Today we lay our ghosts to rest through God's Christmas kiss...

1) God kisses our past through our <u>CONFESSION</u>.

The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God, ² as it is written in Isaiah the prophet: "I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way"— ³ "a voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him." ⁴ And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. ⁶ John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And this was his message: "After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

2) God kisses our present with His COMFORTER.

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. ² Speak tenderly to Jerusalem and proclaim to her that her hard service has been completed, that her sin has been paid for, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins.

Isaiah 40:1-2

3) God kisses our future by Christ's COMING.

⁹ The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance. ¹⁰ But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything done in it will be laid bare. ¹¹ Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives ¹² as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming.

"Letter from Northern Illinois District"

A Statement on Tier 3 Mitigation Measures

Dear Pastors and Congregational Chairs,

Last week, I issued a statement, assuring you that your NID staff would continue to monitor state agencies for updates on mitigation measures that are being set in place by Governor Pritzker in an attempt to keep the public safe in the midst of this pandemic. On November 17, in response to the record-high Covid-19 positivity rates currently being experienced in Illinois, Governor Pritzker issued new mitigations, moving the entire state to the more-restrictive, Tier 3 measures. These measures at to take effect on Friday, November 20.

So that you may be informed as to what is going on in your communities as a result of these new measures, you are encouraged to go to the state of Illinois' website and read the Tier 3 orders as well as the Illinois Department of Public Health's six-page report on houses of worship: www.dph.illinois.gov/covid19/community-guidance/places-worship-guidance. As our NID staff has reviewed these documents the following may be most significant to your congregation:

- 1. The State is highly encouraging churches to follow the Tier 3 mitigation measures for occupancy restrictions and social gatherings wherever possible.
- 2. For Word and Sacrament worship services, these mitigation measures are recommendations, not mandates. Please keep up good and holy work as you provide God's Word and sacrament to congregations. Thank you also for not forgetting your faithful witness to your community.
- 3. Other activities that take place outside of worship services [such as potlucks, group Bible studies, board meetings, etc.] should follow the Tier 3 mitigation measures.
- 4. The state has specifically cited weddings and funerals as falling under the Tier 3 mitigation measures. Please check with your local health department officials for specific questions related to this.
- 5. Where in-person worship does take place, churches are always encouraged to follow the physical and social distancing guidelines as set forth by the Illinois Department of Public Health.

We are heartened to hear how pastors and laity are working together to bring Christ-like care to all in the midst of this crisis. If there's any way we at the NID office may be of service to you, please reach out to us.

We continually lift you up in prayer at the NID office, giving thanks to our Lord for your faithful service, and asking Him to continue to shield you from harm as you bring the gift of His compassionate mercy and the hope of salvation in Christ to the communities you serve. May we be blessed by and reflective of our Lord's encouragement in I Corinthians 15:58. "Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

We will continue to stay up to date on any new measures our state may take to combat this pandemic, and we will continue to keep you informed. We are in this together, and the Almighty Lord is with us all!
