Jesus often has a crowd around him interested in what he is saying and doing. As we read the Gospels, we become like the crowds who follow Jesus, and we are deeply affected by observing and hearing his words. In this Gospel account, the crowd is walking with Jesus on his way to heal the daughter of Jairus. Suddenly Jesus says he is aware of power leaving him.

Desperate for healing, a woman has crawled through the crowd and touched the hem of Jesus' clothes. We are told: "Jesus, aware at once that power had gone out from him, turned around in the crowd and asked, 'Who has touched my clothes?'" The woman admits that she has touched his robe and tells him of her bleeding illness. Those in the crowd hear her tell Jesus about her disease.

When the people in the crowd recognized this sick woman in their midst, they must have been frightened and angry. In that time people considered menstruating women unclean and religiously impure. Some people believed that women bled because they were possessed by an evil spirit. Because of these beliefs, a menstruating woman was kept separate from the community so as not to contaminate others. She was relieved of many of her normal duties. She was not required to draw and carry water from the well. She did not have to cook or serve food to members of the family. She did not have to go to the marketplace. She did not have sexual intercourse. The days of her menstrual period were regarded as a quiet time, a time for herself. (Lev 15:19-31) If the bleeding did not stop, the woman was permanently excluded. Perhaps the patriarchal society at that time thought menstruation unnatural because the men did not experience it.

In this Gospel account the crowd is seeing a woman who has suffered the severe consequences of exclusion. She is terrified because she had broken the purity laws and, in touching Jesus, she had made him ritually unclean as well. Any person she had touched in the crowd was also ritually unclean. Each of them would have to go through a process of ritual cleansing which involved bathing, changing their clothes and being alone until the evening.



She admits her situation to Jesus and the crowd; I can imagine the crowd gasping and moving away from the woman, fearing she had touched someone or all of them. Jesus takes command of the situation and pronounces that her faith has healed her. Jesus does not claim that he healed her; rather, it was her faith. This healing affects the crowd as well. Will the crowd believe in Jesus or believe in the purity laws? Jesus's choice to have the woman healed in a public rather than a private place no doubt awakened many in the crowd to question their own acceptance of the purity laws that were part of their culture.

Each person in the crowd has to wonder at what Jesus just did. Jesus is confronting their assumptions about rules and laws that exclude people rather than protect them. Everyone in the crowd is left with a decision to make just as the woman had to do; continue following Jesus to Jairus's house or perform the ritual cleansing, changing clothes and remaining alone until evening. This desperate woman made her decision and was healed by her faith. Now everyone in the crowd had to decide. In healing the woman in front of many people, Jesus was himself making a public statement, a dangerous one, about his own view of the religious laws he found to be against his ideas of justice and mercy. In doing what he did, he was breaking the religious laws of his time and rebelling against the church leaders.

DEVOTIONAL OF THE WEEK *And then, dear brothers and sisters, you suffered persecution from your own countrymen. In this way, you imitated the believers in God's churches in Judea who, because of their belief in Christ Jesus, suffered from their own people, the Jews. 1 Thessalonians 2:14 (NLT)*

Persecution will come in some form to all Christians. We must first make sure it is not a response to sin in our lives, and then we must, by prayer and fellowship with other believers, patiently endure it, trusting ourselves to God's care.

Donna Wasilkoff Day

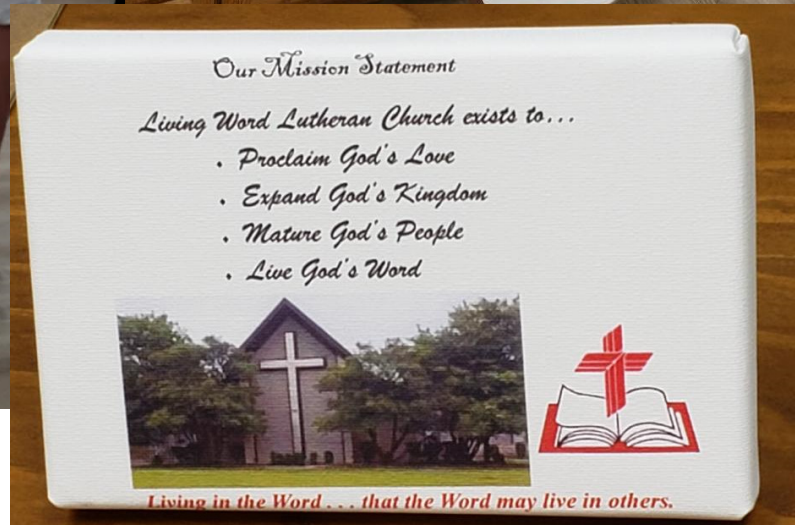

Mission of the Month

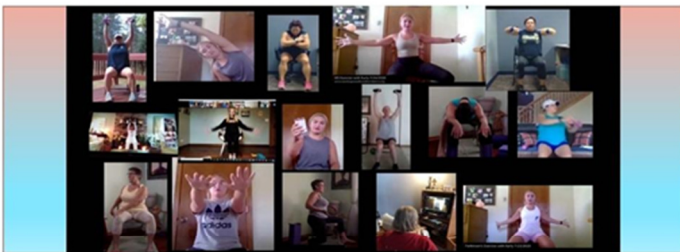

WE RECEIVED THE FOLLOWING UPDATE from the last Mission of the Month in May. Redeeming Life Outreach Ministries sent us this letter in an email.

Hello, Pastor Lee!

Greetings to you in Christ! I hope this email finds you well. It has been a very busy summer here at Redeeming Life. It's time that I give you an update on where we stand with the Illinois Expansion Project.

First Things First!

The contract for purchase of the parsonage at 2501 Helm Road is fully executed. We have begun our due diligence required to work toward closing on this property. This will include survey, plat, design, planning, zoning and any additional inspections required. We already have a full inspection done by a licensed Illinois inspection company. This inspection was generously paid for by one of our NID pastors and his wife!

It's Time to Hurry Up...and Wait!

In mid-May, a meeting took place with RLOM representatives, Faith Lutheran, Immanuel Lutheran East Dundee and the Village of Carpentersville. We had the opportunity to present the mission and ministry to the Village so they had a better understanding of the kind of home we will be operating and how it might impact the community. There are a few zoning issues that still need to be worked through. The Village representatives were cooperative and willing to help us through the process. Until it is resolved, we will wait upon the Lord!

Still Moving Toward the Start of the Renovation

In the next several weeks, we will be busy fulfilling the requirements of the contract and clearly defining the remodeling project plan. Our hope is to be ready to begin demolition within a few days of closing.

In late May, I spent a wonderful week in Illinois and met with many pastors and lay leaders. I am completely blown away by the passion, enthusiasm, and energy I felt wherever I went. It was great to meet so many new friends and supporters. Thank you for extending warm hospitality and friendship in Christ. It was comforting and welcoming!

LUTHERAN CHURCH CHARITIES have been very busy locally and nationally. At 10:45 pm, Sunday, June 20, a confirmed EF-3 tornado and catastrophic storms raged through Northern Illinois, causing extensive damage in the hardest-hit areas of **Woodridge, Naperville, and Darien, as well as Burr Ridge and Downers Grove**. Straight-line winds of at least 70mph tore through other communities. Buildings have collapsed, homes heavily damaged or leveled, multiple power lines down, large trees uprooted, and dangerous debris scattered. Major destruction has left many roads and neighborhoods impassible. At least 250 homes were damaged, 26 are reported as uninhabitable. During the first 48 hours after the tornado, **Tim Hetzner, LCC President/CEO, Kathy O'Day, LCC Director of Disaster Response, and LCC Lutheran Early Response Team (L.E.R.T) chainsaw team leaders** visited affected first responders and homeowners to assess the damage to their property. Work orders were immediately scheduled for LCC L.E.R.T. volunteers to begin property clean-up starting on Tuesday.



Pastor Mark Schultz from **Trinity Lutheran Church in Lisle** invited LCC to serve out of their church. We are also working with **Bethany Lutheran Church in Naperville**. **Woodridge Mayor Gina Cunningham** and **Illinois State Senator John Curran** were present to thank LCC Disaster Response and L.E.R.T. chainsaw volunteers for everything we are doing to help their community. They are familiar with our response to disaster and crisis situations and welcomed our presence in assisting the residents in the impacted communities. The American Red Cross referred a homeowner to Lutheran Church Charities for chainsaw assistance. This family has received much roof and interior damage to their home, about 40 trees down in their front and back yards, loss of power and lines to home, and a damaged vehicle from falling trees. In addition to this devastation, they are facing the possible loss of their young adult child to

cancer. We told them to take care of their family and we will take care of their property, whenever they are ready for us. They deeply appreciated the compassion and hope of Jesus Christ we showed to them for their difficult situation.

Past Mission of the Month Updates

One of the first homeowners visited is a Lisle-Woodridge firefighter who just returned home from his long shift of responding to his devastated community. His property has many downed trees and hanging tree limbs. An LCC L.E.R.T. team was sent to his property first thing on Tuesday to start the recovery effort. LCC prayed with him, his wife, and his daughter to give them hope and reassurance that God is with them during this challenging time.

They also visited the home of a Lisle-Woodridge police officer who is helping to keep his community safe. The tree in his front yard has many dangerous hanging limbs. Work on his property was scheduled for Wednesday. LCC L.E.R.T. chainsaw teams are helping a neighbor of **Pastor Mike Curtis from Trinity – Lisle**. The large tree on their property is heavily damaged as well as the tree in their front yard. L.E.R.T. chainsaw teams used their heavy equipment to safely clean up the property and help them in their time of need. Wayne and his wife were presented with a signed slice of the tree taken down and are thankful for our immediate assistance.
