## "God Loves You"

Ever wonder if God loves you?

After all, the one Bible verse everyone knows is John 3:16: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." But here's the thing: it's one thing to have head knowledge about God's love. It's something else altogether to believe it so deeply and strongly that it utterly transforms every aspect of my life.

## **Experiencing God's Love**

The first type of knowledge – head knowledge – is never lacking on my part. I know my theology pretty well.

Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so. If you were to ask me if God loves me, I'd say, "Yes, of course!" But when it comes to actually experiencing the reality that God loves me – that's sorely lacking on my part. And while I'm not a believer in elevating feelings and experiences over the rock-solid truth of God's word, I do think it's important that I both believe that God loves in my head and actually experience God's love in my heart. Just like I want my children to both know and experience my love, I believe that God wants me to know and experience the staggering, glorious, life-giving reality that God loves me. So how can I grow in this experiential knowledge of God's love? I don't think it's complicated. Scripture makes it abundantly, overwhelmingly clear just how crazy God is about me. I simply need to take hold of these truths to the point where they move me from knowing that God is love to the point where I feel and believe that God is love. Here are five different ways that Scripture tells me that God loves me.

#### 1. God Loves Me and Chose Me To Be Saved

Scripture makes it very clear that in eternity past, God chose me to be saved. Before I had done anything good or bad. God decided that he was going to forgive my sins and adopt me in Jesus Christ. Why did he choose me? Because he loved me with a deep, profound, inexplicable love. As Ephesians 1 puts it, "In love he predestined us..." Though the doctrine of predestination may seem mysterious or confusing, one thing is NOT confusing: the reason God predestined me to be saved was that he really, truly loved me. He wouldn't have chosen me to be saved if he didn't possess an extravagant love for me. When I really think about it, it takes my breath away. God loves me and chose to save me.

#### 2. God Loves Me and Gave His Son For Me

There is no greater, more unassailable proof that God loves me than the fact that he gave his Son to die for my sins. God wanted to be in a relationship with me so much that he was willing to sacrifice his only Son to make that happen. Though my many sins against God deserve the furious wrath of God, he poured that wrath out on Jesus instead. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die—but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Is there any greater proof that God loves me? This is love that I simply can't fathom. Christ died for me even though I had ZERO righteousness of my own. He didn't die for a good person, he died for me, a wicked sinner who wanted nothing to do with him. Is there any greater, more convincing proof that God loves me than the cross? If I want to truly know and experience the love of God, the starting place is the cross. It's there that I see the breathtaking heights of God's love and the bewildering lengths he was willing to go to save me. God loves me, and the cross is proof of it.

## "Our Freewill Offering"

Psalm 54 says: "I will sacrifice a freewill offering to you." How will WE sacrifice? What is OUR freewill offering ...?

## 1) I will commit to the Lord's CAUSE.

<sup>18</sup> Because the LORD revealed their plot to me, I knew it, for at that time he showed me what they were doing. <sup>19</sup> I had been like a gentle lamb led to the slaughter; I did not realize that they had plotted against me, saying, "Let us destroy the tree and its fruit; let us cut him off from the land of the living, that his name be remembered no more." <sup>20</sup> But you, LORD Almighty, who judge righteously and test the heart and mind, let me see your vengeance on them, for to you I have committed my cause.

### 2) I will keep God's COMMANDS.

<sup>7</sup> Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. <sup>8</sup> Come near to God and he will come near to you. Wash your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. <sup>9</sup> Grieve, mourn and wail. They will kill him, and after three days he will rise." <sup>32</sup> But they did not understand what he meant and were afraid to ask him about it. <sup>33</sup> They came to Capernaum. When he was in the house, he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the road?" <sup>34</sup> But they kept quiet because on the way they had argued about who was the greatest. <sup>35</sup> Sitting down, Jesus called the Twelve and said, "Anyone who wants to be first must be the very last, and the servant of all." # Mission of the Month

**MISSION OF THE MONTH** for September, the Mission of the Month will be African Radio Ministries, we will see a short video for their outreach and organization, and I have included some information from their website here.



In January, 2005 African Radio Ministries (ARM) began broadcasting weekly Lutheran worship programs in Africa. We are currently aimed at two regions: In **Liberia**, programs are produced and broadcasted from four different counties in four languages: Kissi, Kpelle, Krahn and Loma.

In **Ethiopia**, programs are produced in the Addis Ababa office then broadcast from South Africa. They are offered in two languages, Amharic and Oromifa . In 2016, there were 51 church plants recorded through ARM listener groups.

Listeners may contact the ARM staff at these offices to learn more about what it means to follow Christ.

### 3. God Loves Me and Adopted Me

Simply forgiving my sins would be proof enough that God loves me, but he doesn't stop there. He piles proof upon proof of his love. In addition to forgiving all my sins, God adopted me as his son. It wasn't enough for him to just forgive me. God deeply wanted me to be part of his family – to share in the overflowing joy of the Trinity. This is a glorious, praise-inducing truth. I have been given the full rights of a son of God, including an inheritance from God himself. I have unique access to God that is only available to his family members. Even though he is the Holy One, the one who causes prophets to cry out, "Woe is me!" I can call him, "Abba, Father." I am adopted by God and I have the King of Kings as my Father. God loves me, and my adoption as his son is proof of that.

#### 4. God Loves Me and Loves To Bless Me

God's love for me is infinitely greater than my love for my kids, and he proves that he loves me by pouring out blessing after blessing on me. God blesses me in so many ways, whether it's healing me from an illness, providing for me financially, speaking to me through my Bible reading, or answering prayers in very specific ways. When I try to count all the ways God has blessed me, I find myself saying, "Bless the Lord, O my soul!" God loves me and proves that by blessing me in a thousand different ways.

#### Why Does God Love Us So Much?

Ultimately, the reason God loves us so much is because that's who He is. I believe that God loves me because 1 John 4:8 tells us that God is love. God's love for us flows out of His very nature. Our relationship with God is not founded on what we do. Rather, God loves us simply because He is love and He delights in us.
