

### "All About Jesus"

Hebrews 3:1-6 - Therefore, holy brothers, you who share in a heavenly calling, consider Jesus, the Apostle and High Priest of our confession, who was faithful to Him who appointed Him, just as Moses also was faithful in all God's house. For Jesus has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses—as much more glory as the builder of a house has more honor than the house itself. (For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God.) Now Moses was faithful in all God's house as a servant, to testify to the things that were to be spoken later, but Christ is faithful over God's house as a Son. And we are His house, if indeed we hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope. The letter to the Hebrews is a great lead-in to Lent. By the start of the third chapter, the writer has confirmed Jesus' supremacy, His position as God's only Son, His role as Creator of the universe, His place at God's right hand, His achievement as the Founder of our faith, and His superiority to the prophet Moses, which for the Jews was a hard, if not impossible, act to follow (see Hebrews 1-2).

The letter to the Hebrews has much more to say as well. It exhorts us to be mindful of God as He speaks to us. "Therefore, as the Holy Spirit says, 'Today, if you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion, on the day of testing in the wilderness.' ... But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called 'today,' that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. ... For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but One who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (Hebrews 3:7-8, 13; 4:15-16).

As we begin Lent next week, our thoughts are drawn to what God has done for us in Jesus through His life, death, and resurrection. Jesus has become "the Source of eternal salvation to all who obey Him" (Hebrews 5:9b). "For by a single offering He has perfected for all time those who are being sanctified" (Hebrews 10:14). This is the saving work we honor and stand in awe of during Lent.

Jesus has done it all for you and for me. Jesus, "who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2b). He is our Lord and Savior, our Victor over the powers of darkness, our Shepherd who leads us unto life eternal.

This is the Jesus we set our eyes on during Lent—God's Son who has been faithful in all things.

"Now may the God of peace who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great Shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, equip you with everything good that you may do His will, working in us that which is pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen" (Hebrews 13:20-21).

### Mission of the Month

**FEBRUARY MISSION OF THE MONTH** is David's Harp Foundation. Please see the information below for their outreach program and mission. This can also be found on our website and the bulletin board.



David's Harp is an outgrowth of the work and development of St. Paul's Music Conservatory in Council Bluffs, IA. In 2009, St. Paul's Lutheran Church established a formal music conservatory in order to raise up church musicians and proclaim the Gospel through music. This manner of music education was well received by the congregation and community alike. Overtime, this conservatory not only grew but has become a center of music education within the Council Bluffs community and has developed resources specifically for use in the parish based music conservatory. Having positive reception from across the synod, the leadership of SPMC has entertained interested ministry leaders from all across the country seeking to establish similar forms of outreach in their own context. Seeing that the work of the local conservatory, resource development, and collaboration with leaders from across the country would be too much for one parish to effectively handle, the leadership of SPMC called for help and created a new organization called David's Harp. The mission of this entity is simple: Produce music resources and produce centers of musical development around the world.

David's Harp, through its resource development and centers of music education care deeply about the following:

MISSIONS Spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ throughout the world.

**OUTREACH** Reaching into communities and neighborhoods that surround our churches, schools and mission sites all over the world with the message of Christ.

**EDUCATION** Catechizing all ages in the faith through the rich hymns of the Lutheran Church.

**YOUTH** Teaching even the youngest among us in every community as we bring them up in the faith.

**MUSIC** Using the enormous power of music as the vehicle for all of this.

David's Harp believes that the Lutheran church is well-positioned for intentional outreach through music. Through strategic planning and collaboration in the areas of resource generation and the establishment of centers of music, David's Harp will support the Synod's churches, schools and missions in spreading the Gospel. Music centers in the foreign mission field are indeed realistic! In fact, music is often one of the most effective ways of connecting people who find themselves specifically in the mission field. In a foreign mission context, the church often competes with the influence of different strains of Christianity and different forms of paganism. Music helps lead a community into a culture that is not only Christian, but truly Lutheran! The best and most practical summary of that Lutheran culture is found in our liturgy and hymns. Having that music preserved in a hymnal which is used and taught regularly further facilitates faithful worship and a rich sacramental life. Music in a foreign context also carries the culture of the Church to places where pastors are denied access. A music studio or conservatory, for example, may be permitted when a church is not. A music teacher may be able to travel where a pastor or missionary cannot. And sacred music itself, especially recorded music, may find its way through the Internet or on the airwaves to places no missionary can enter. All of these are ways music centers can benefit the mission field.

# 2-27-22 Message Outline

### "Worship at His Holy Mountain"

Psalm 99 says: "Exalt the Lord our God and worship at his holy mountain." Come worship at Zion, the place where God dwells...!

### 1) Come worship at MOUNT NEBO.

34 Then Moses climbed Mount Nebo from the plains of Moab to the top of Pisgah, across from Jericho. There the LORD showed him the whole land—from Gilead to Dan, <sup>2</sup> all of Naphtali, the territory of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the Mediterranean Sea, <sup>3</sup> the Negev and the whole region from the Valley of Jericho, the City of Palms, as far as Zoar. <sup>4</sup> Then the LORD said to him, "This is the land I promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob when I said, 'I will give it to your descendants.' I have let you see it with your eyes, but you will not cross over into it." <sup>5</sup> And Moses the servant of the LORD died there in Moab, as the LORD had said.

### 2) Come worship at MOUNT CALVARY.

3 <u>Therefore</u>, holy brothers and sisters, who share in the heavenly calling, fix your thoughts on Jesus, whom we acknowledge as our apostle and high priest. <sup>2</sup> He was faithful to the one who appointed him, just as Moses was faithful in all God's house. <sup>3</sup> Jesus has been found worthy of greater honor than Moses, just as the builder of a house has greater honor than the house itself.

Hebrews 3:1-3

### 3) Come worship at the Mount of TRANSFIGURATION.

<sup>28</sup> About eight days after Jesus said this, he took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray. <sup>29</sup> As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. <sup>30</sup> Two men, Moses and Elijah, appeared in glorious splendor, talking with Jesus. <sup>31</sup> They spoke about his departure, which he was about to bring to fulfillment at Jerusalem. <sup>32</sup> Peter and his companions were very sleepy, but when they became fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. <sup>33</sup> As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, "Master, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." (He did not know what he was saying.) <sup>34</sup> While he was speaking, a cloud appeared and covered them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. <sup>35</sup> A voice came from the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him."
