'Characteristics of a Good and Faithful Servant"

No doubt, people want to be identified as good and faithful servants. What exactly does that mean as it is recorded in Matthew 25:23? What did Jesus have in mind when He spoke those words? "Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master."

- Notice Jesus did not say "good and popular servant" or "good and successful servant"? Jesus'
- words were "good and faithful servant." That tells us a lot about the type of servant Jesus was
- talking about. All Christians should long to hear those words addressed to them. The relevant question is: "What are you doing to hear those words from the Master?"

#### 1. Be Saved

- In order to hear those words, one must belong to the Master. Therefore, the very first way to
- hear those important words is to be saved by grace through faith (Ephesians 2:8-9) "to do good
- works" (Ephesians 2:10). Jesus becomes your Savior once you confess with your mouth that He
- died and God raised Him from the dead, according to Romans 10:9-10. Then you must be faith-
- ful by allowing Him to become your Lord. It is important to know that in order to hear what the
- master told his servants, you must be a servant. Unbelievers will never hear those words. Un-
- faithful believers will never hear those words.

#### 2. Be Faithful

Notice that the master in the parable used the expression "faithful servant" twice to indicate its importance. Being faithful is doing what God commands you to do and refraining from doing what He commands you not to do. Our faithfulness depends on even the little that we do for the kingdom of God.

#### 3. Be Available

A faithful servant is also an available servant. Our appointment books are usually full with something going on every waking hour of the day and part of the night with very little time left to focus on God and the things of God. A faithful servant spends quality time with God.

We should be available to go where God sends us. We should say like Isaiah, "Here am I. Send me!" (Isaiah 6:8) and not go in the opposite direction like Jonah did when God sent him to Nineveh.

God wants availability more than ability. That's because when you are available, He will equip you along the way. When Jesus called the fishermen, they knew nothing about Him or what He expected until they had spent time with Him.

#### 4. Be a Witness

When we get saved, we should share the gospel with others so they will know the saving power of Jesus Christ, His death, burial, resurrection, and ascension. The Bible tells us to make disciples and teach others about God and all things relating to God (Matthew 28:18-20).

We should not keep what we know about God to ourselves. We should become good witnesses before we can become good and faithful servants.

#### 5. Practice Forgiveness

When Peter asked Jesus how many times he should forgive others, Jesus told him to forgive seventy times seven. Surely, Jesus did not mean to literally forgive 490 times and stop forgiving when that number has been reached. Instead, Jesus was indicating that Peter and the rest of us should practice forgiveness and keep on forgiving as long as we live. According to 1 Peter 2:2, "When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to [the Father] who judges justly." Jesus Himself practiced forgiveness. On the cross, His first statement was "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do (Luke 23:34). Continued on Bottom of Page 2

#### 6. Show Humility

Showing humility is the opposite of being filled with pride. A person who does not demonstrate humility is one who takes credit for everything that happens to him instead of giving God all the glory. Unless a person is humble, he will not be called a good and faithful servant. That is because he usurps all the glory that belongs to God and gives it to himself.

#### 7. Help Others

In order to be a good and faithful servant, we must help others. First John 3:17 says, "If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person?" We should be Christlike and "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way, we will fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2). Every saved person has been given spiritual gifts to be used to help others as a way to demonstrate being a good and faithful servant.

#### 8. Participate in Spiritual Disciplines

A good and faithful servant knows he should always participate in spiritual disciplines that include praying, studying the Bible, attending church, singing, praising God, meditating, journaling and enjoying God's presence.

Psalm 4 says: "How long will you people turn my glory into shame? How long will you love delusions and seek false gods? Know that the Lord has set apart his faithful servant for himself; the Lord hears when I call to him." Are you a faithful servant…?

#### 1) A faithful servant PROPHESIES TRUTH.

<sup>8</sup> But as soon as Jeremiah finished telling all the people everything the Lord had commanded him to say, the priests, the prophets and all the people seized him and said, "You must die! <sup>9</sup> Why do you prophesy in the Lord's name that this house will be like Shiloh and this city will be desolate and deserted?"

Jeremiah 26:8-9

#### 2) A faithful servant STANDS FIRM.

<sup>17</sup> Join together in following my example, brothers and sisters, and just as you have us as a model, keep your eyes on those who live as we do. <sup>18</sup> For, as I have often told you before and now tell you again even with tears, many live as enemies of the cross of Christ. <sup>19</sup> Their destiny is destruction, their god is their stomach, and their glory is in their shame. Their mind is set on earthly things. <sup>20</sup> But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ, <sup>21</sup> who, by the power that enables him to bring everything under his control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body. <sup>4</sup> Therefore, my brothers and sisters, you whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, dear friends!

## Ways to Help Ukraine



**HELPING UKRAINE** We have received several different emails this past week as to being able to help Ukraine. I felt that I should share them in our newsletter this month. The emails came from the Northern Illinois District and the Lutheran Church Charities respectively.

From the Northern Illinois District:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The violence in Ukraine continues. Those in Ukraine and those fleeing to neighboring countries face great need.

Our Office of International Mission — especially through our Eurasia region and the Rev. James Krikava, the Synod's associate executive director of Eurasia and Asia Operations — is working with partner churches, missionaries and others in Europe to help care for those fleeing Ukraine. Krikava has been working with Bishop Serge Maschewski of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ukraine (ELCU) to assist the people of the ELCU who remain in Ukraine, including pastors who continue to care for people.

Please encourage your congregations to pray for Ukraine. You can also <u>share with them the following story</u>, which includes opportunities for giving to this necessary work.

As we repent and join together in meditation about our Savior's precious death and resurrection, we also pray for and care for all those for whom Christ died and rose.

Here's the email below from Lutheran Church Charities along with the pictures on the following page.

Urgent financial assistance is needed for women, children, and the elderly as able men stay to defend the Ukrainian homeland. Lutheran Church Charities IS WORKING WITH the **Ukrainian Lutheran Church (ULC)** and the **Christian Friends of New Americans (CFNA)** to support those staying in Ukraine as well as those fleeing to other countries during these desperate and challenging times. LCC will BE WORKING with Christian Ukrainian families here in the United States that have families in Ukraine or who are displaced in Poland.

The Ukrainian Lutheran Church (ULC) and its 18 national pastors spiritually lead and serve 2,500 members, 24 established congregations, and 12 mission congregations in Ukraine by sharing the hope of the gospel with others around them who do not know Christ. They are committed to remaining in Ukraine to help their fellow Ukrainians who choose to stay in their homeland survive during these horrific conditions.

The Christian Friends of New Americans (CFNA) connect with outreach-minded congregations to welcome and support refugees fleeing to the United States. With the current Ukrainian crisis, they are prepared to support an increased need to help these individuals and families who come to the United States, often with little or no possessions, establish a new life.
