

"God Will Give You More than You Can Handle"

You've probably heard – or maybe you've even said – "God will never give you more than you can handle." Sounds really good but there's just one problem. The Bible doesn't teach that. Many people point to 1 Corinthians 10:13 to back up this "Christian teaching." But is that what Paul meant when he wrote: "God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear?" Let's take a quick look at that passage.

What is the Promise of 1 Corinthians 10:13?

- This verse is often taken out of context, so let's pull back and look at the surrounding passage
- to find out what Paul was talking about. (See this post for more information on "biblical con-
- text.")The topic of 1 Corinthians 10:1-13 is temptation and being prepared to resist it. At the end
- of chapter 9, Paul encouraged the believers in Corinth to practice strict spiritual discipline like
- he did. Chapter 10 begins with a "for" (1 Corinthians 10:1 NIV). Paul wanted them to be self-
- disciplined because he did not want them to follow the bad example of Israel in the wilderness
- who gave into temptation and disobeyed God. Because of their disobedience that generation
- died in the desert and never entered the promised land. Their story was recorded as a warning for the Corinthians and for us (1 Corinthians 10:11). Then, in 1 Corinthians 10:12-13, Paul out-
- lines what we should do instead of giving into temptation:
- 1. Keep up our guard Thinking we are too strong to fall into sin makes us vulnerable.
- 2. Don't believe the lie that our temptation is extreme or unusual No temptation will come our way that hasn't already been part of the human experience.
- 3. Look for God's escape plan God is faithful. He will not allow any temptation to come our way that is too great for us to resist. He will always provide a way for us to say no and the strength to bear up under the pull of sin. Okay, did you see that? Number 3 is the real promise of verse 13. God will never allow us to be tempted to sin beyond what we can resist. So what about this question: "Does God ever give us more hardship than we can handle?" The short answer is "yes." But let's turn to another one of Paul's letters for a more in-depth explanation.

God Will Give You More than You can Handle

In his second letter to the believers in Corinth, Paul wrote about hardships he experienced in Asia: We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about the troubles we experienced in the province of Asia. We were under great pressure, far beyond our ability to endure, so that we despaired of life itself. Indeed, we felt we had received the sentence of death. But this happened that we might not rely on ourselves but on God, who raises the dead. 2 Corinthians 1:8-9, NIV The same biblical author that wrote 1 Corinthians 10:13 also wrote 2 Corinthians 1:8-9. Paul knew that God would allow him to experience more hardship than he could bear. He had lived it. He had pressure in Asia that was far beyond his ability to endure. Why? Why did God allow Paul – and why does God allow us – to experience trials and difficulties, grief and pain, more than we can bear? One reason is found right in this passage – so that we will rely on God and not on our own strength and power. Hear Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 1:10: He has delivered us from such a deadly peril, and he will deliver us again. On him we have set our hope that he will continue to deliver us. 2 Corinthians 1:10, NIV When we are unable to deliver ourselves, God is able. When we are unable to stand up under the pressure, it will be God's strength in us. No, God does not promise that He will never give

us more than we can handle. Instead, He holds out His hand and tells us to lean on Him.

DEVOTIONAL OF THE WEEK "But sir, you don't have a rope or a bucket," she said, "and this well is very deep. Where would you get this living water? And besides, do you think you're greater than our ancestor Jacob, who gave us this well? How can you offer better water than he and his sons and his animals enjoyed?"- John 4:12-13 (NLT)

As Jesus is speaking with the Samaritan woman, he engages with her around commonalities between their two different cultures. He continues the conversation until she brings up a spiritual idea, that the well they are at goes back to Jacob, the patriarch of the twelve tribes of Israel. Then Jesus goes into the heavier spiritual stuff, ending with the revelation that he is in fact the Messiah. In the same way, as we deal with those of a different (physical or spiritual) culture, we should be alert for common ground that we can use to bridge the gap between us and foster deeper spiritual conversations.

Psalm 85 says: "You, Lord, showed favor to your land." How does God show his favor to us...?

1) God shows us favor through His FORGIVENESS.

⁷ "Son of man, I have made you a watchman for the people of Israel; so hear the word I speak and give them warning from me...¹¹ Say to them, 'As surely as I live, declares the Sovereign LORD, I take no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but rather that they turn from their ways and live. Turn! Turn from your evil ways! Why will you die, people of Israel?'

Ezekiel 33:7, 11

2) God shows us favor by His FAITHFULNESS.

¹³ No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can endure it.

1 Corinthians 10:13

3) God shows us favor with His FORBEARANCE.

⁶ [Jesus] told this parable: "A man had a fig tree growing in his vineyard, and he went to look for fruit on it but did not find any. ⁷ So he said to the man who took care of the vineyard, 'For three years now I've been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and haven't found any. HELPING UKRAINE We have received several different emails this past week as to being able to help Ukraine. I felt that I should share them in our newsletter this month. The emails came from the Northern Illinois District and the Lutheran Church Charities respectively.

From the Northern Illinois District:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The violence in Ukraine continues. Those in Ukraine and those fleeing to neighboring countries face great need.

Our Office of International Mission — especially through our Eurasia region and the Rev. James Krikava, the Synod's associate executive director of Eurasia and Asia Operations — is working with partner churches, missionaries and others in Europe to help care for those fleeing Ukraine. Krikava has been working with Bishop Serge Maschewski of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ukraine (ELCU) to assist the people of the ELCU who remain in Ukraine, including pastors who continue to care for people.

Please encourage your congregations to pray for Ukraine. You can also <u>share with them the following story</u>, which includes opportunities for giving to this necessary work.

As we repent and join together in meditation about our Savior's precious death and resurrection, we also pray for and care for all those for whom Christ died and rose.

Here's the email below from Lutheran Church Charities along with the pictures on the following page.

Urgent financial assistance is needed for women, children, and the elderly as able men stay to defend the Ukrainian homeland. Lutheran Church Charities IS WORKING WITH the **Ukrainian Lutheran Church (ULC)** and the **Christian Friends of New Americans (CFNA)** to support those staying in Ukraine as well as those fleeing to other countries during these desperate and challenging times. LCC will BE WORKING with Christian Ukrainian families here in the United States that have families in Ukraine or who are displaced in Poland.

The Ukrainian Lutheran Church (ULC) and its 18 national pastors spiritually lead and serve 2,500 members, 24 established congregations, and 12 mission congregations in Ukraine by sharing the hope of the gospel with others around them who do not know Christ. They are committed to remaining in Ukraine to help their fellow Ukrainians who choose to stay in their homeland survive during these horrific conditions.

The Christian Friends of New Americans (CFNA) connect with outreach-minded congregations to welcome and support refugees fleeing to the United States. With the current Ukrainian crisis, they are prepared to support an increased need to help these individuals and families who come to the United States, often with little or no possessions, establish a new life.
