# "Three Ways God Delivers You"

God promises He will deliver us. So... how is that promise working out for you? Have you asked God to deliver you, but still find yourself sick or sad or scared or stuck? If He is our Deliverer, why isn't He delivering on His promise? He is.

Sometimes the way God keeps His promises is painful for us. And sometimes we don't even realize He is delivering us because we don't recognize the way He does it. If you are sick or sad or scared or stuck, I want to show you the ways God delivers you.

3 Ways God Delivers

#### 1. God Delivers FROM

- Thousands of years ago, God delivered King Hezekiah from his sickbed (Isaiah 38). The king
- was wasting away and near death. He cried out to God. God healed. Hezekiah was deliv-
- 2 ered *from* his illness.
- Sometimes that is what God does. He delivers us from something hard by removing it or pre-
- venting it in the first place. This is our favorite kind of deliverance, right? When God delivers this way, we clap and praise and brag on Him!
- But, this isn't the only way God delivers. Sometimes He doesn't prevent the suffering and He
- doesn't remove it, but that doesn't mean He isn't our Deliverer.

#### 2. God Delivers THROUGH

Thousands of years ago, God delivered three Hebrew young men *through* a fire (<u>Daniel 3:16–28</u>). They refused to bow down and worship King Nebuchadnezzar. They were thrown into the furnace as their punishment and not only were they not burned, they walked right out of that fire and didn't even smell like smoke. They were delivered *through* the fire.

God promises when we walk through the valley of the shadow of death, He is with us. That means if He is allowing us to go through it, He goes through it with us

#### 3. God Delivers OUT OF

Thousands of years ago, God delivered Stephen *out of* his stoning and *into* heaven (Acts 7:54 – 60).

Stephen was falsely accused of heresy by the religious leaders, and ultimately dragged outside the city and stoned. As he was dying, Stephen asked Christ to receive his spirit. God took him *out of* that terror and *into* His presence.

If he had survived broken and bruised, we could say that God delivered him through that awful event. But, he didn't go through it, he went out of it to heaven. It became the portal through which Stephen was ushered into a better — the best — place.

Maybe this side of heaven, we don't see it that way. But, within a nanosecond of her arrival there, I bet she wouldn't have had it any other way.

When you think about the different ways God keeps His promise to deliver us, can you see His deliverance in your life? Has He delivered you *from* something? Has He delivered you *through* something? Do you see how He may deliver you *out of* it and *into* a better place? Oh my friend, maybe you have endured — or are enduring — something so awful that you are weeping right now just thinking about it, wondering why God let it happen. Why didn't He deliver you from it?

Maybe the fact you're reading this right now is an indication that God is still in the process of delivering you. He is delivering you *through* it for a purpose higher than you can even imagine. He is delivering you *through* it because He cares deeply for you. I wish I knew all the answers.

**DEVOTIONAL OF THE WEEK** While Jesus was teaching in the Temple, he called out, "Yes, you know me, and you know where I come from. But I'm not here on my own. The one who sent me is true, and you don't know him." - John 7:28 (NLT)

Growing up, Jesus seemed like an ordinary Jewish boy (except for being sinless, of course), and certainly didn't do the spectacular miracles of his ministry after his baptism. So some people held this against him, since it didn't fit their expectations of the Messiah. They used it as an argument against his teaching. Likewise, people today may use our past or our lack of worldly success or recognition as an argument against the truth of what we say about God and his salvation plan for all of us. That should not deter us; we can acknowledge whatever shortcomings there may be in our lives while still proclaiming God's truth.

#### "I Will Deliver You!"

In Psalm 50 the Lord tells us: "Call on me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you will honor me...!"

#### 1) God delivers the nations through His DESCENDENTS.

<sup>22</sup> "As the new heavens and the new earth that I make will endure before me," declares the LORD, "so will your name and descendants endure. <sup>23</sup> From one New Moon to another and from one Sabbath to another, all mankind will come and bow down before me," says the LORD.

Isaiah 66:22-23

#### 2) God delivers me through His <u>DISCIPLINE</u>.

<sup>4</sup> In your struggle against sin, you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. <sup>5</sup> And have you completely forgotten this word of encouragement that addresses you as a father addresses his son? It says, "My son, do not make light of the Lord's discipline, and do not lose heart when he rebukes you, <sup>6</sup> because the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and he chastens everyone he accepts as his son." <sup>7</sup> Endure hardship as discipline; God is treating you as his children. For what children are not disciplined by their father? <sup>8</sup> If you are not disciplined—and everyone undergoes discipline—then you are not legitimate, not true sons and daughters at all. <sup>9</sup> Moreover, we have all had human fathers who disciplined us and we respected them for it. How much more should we submit to the Father of spirits and live! <sup>10</sup> They disciplined us for a little while as they thought best; but God disciplines us for our good, in order that we may share in his holiness. <sup>11</sup> No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it.

### 3) God delivers us through His DOOR.

<sup>22</sup> Then Jesus went through the towns and villages, teaching as he made his way to Jerusalem. <sup>23</sup> Someone asked him, "Lord, are only a few people going to be saved?" He said to them, <sup>24</sup> "Make every effort to enter through the narrow door, because many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able to… <sup>30</sup> Indeed there are those who are last who will be first, and first who will be last."



# Council Meeting Notes

Tuesday, August 16, 2022, at 7pm

Attendees: Pastor John, Bob G, Diana M, Bill M, Jim M, Neal H, and Donna W (for Transition Team update)

Pastor John opened in prayer at 7:05pm

Meeting was turned over to Donna to inform the council about the meeting the transition team had with Pastor Johnson from Christ Lutheran on Monday, August 15th. The meeting was positive and Christ Lutheran's boards have been informed about the possible partnership and were excited about it. Pastor Johnson did ask that we provide them with a 5-year projected budget with what we would be able to afford for a pastor. They would also like to see our constitution and see our church insurance and security. They are still willing to pay 2/3 for a pastor and we would pay 1/3rd. He also made sure that his church and ours understands we are still Living Word this is just a partnership to help grow God's kingdom. Also, we wouldn't worry about hours it is more this pastor would help both churches with their needs. Pastor Johnson knows of a handful of pastors that could be interested in this arrangement. He needs to be able to know what we can pay a pastor before calling them to know if we will be in some of their price ranges. Christ Lutheran would like to be able to vote on the pastor as well after we have interviewed them just to make sure both churches are happy with the pastor and that all needs will be met. He also asks that we at Living Word form an elder's board. Elders help keep the checks and balances in the church. He did say we could look for a vacancy pastor in case we don't have a pastor before Pastor Lee leaves. Donna did also speak with Pastor Croone. She explained this possible partnership and shared with him our financials. He is ok with waiting longer until we get everything figured out. It should be noted that Pastor Croone would not be someone Christ Lutheran would want. Donna then exited the meeting.

We then talked about the preschool budget. It is budgeted for 8 students hoping that we could meet that midyear. We have 5 students 4 starting in September and the 5<sup>th</sup> on October 1<sup>st</sup> when she turns 3. Bob made a motion to accept the budget, Jim 2<sup>nd</sup> and the council voted unanimously to accept it.

Diana made mention that she was able to get the comcast bill lowered to \$169 a month with a higher speed and their modem. She will call back again next year to see what promotions.

Our ComEd bill was significantly higher for July by over \$400.

Our offering was close to what we was budgeted but we did miss a Sunday due to being closed.

Neal motioned that all the bills for July be approved. Jim 2<sup>nd</sup> and the council voted unanimously.

Bill will get Diana set up in ADP to start getting paid as the preschool teacher starting August 31st.

Jim has called Affiliated for the fire extinguishers, and they are cheaper than Fire Science. He will continue to work on getting everything set up so our fire extinguishers can be replaced.

The copier is giving us problems again. Someone is coming in

Jim would also like to get some different quotes to get our sprinklers fixed next year.

Bill got something in the mail for Concordia plan for disability plan and survivor plan. He will contact to find who we are covering on this plan.

Northern IL pastor conference letter \$345.72 to send a pastor to these conferences. Pastor John would consider going but 1st payment is due September 15th. We will table this for now due to not having a pastor.
