Volume 31, Issue 38 "Discovering Your Vision" You don't get to decide God's purpose for your life, you discover it. How? Through prayer. God says, 'I know the plans I have for you'. Your parents may not have planned you, but God did. You may be overwhelmed with problems, but God sees your potential. David's family didn't think he would amount to much. But where they saw a shepherd boy, God saw a king. Looking back, David wrote: 'You saw me before I was born. Every day of my life was recorded in your book. Every moment was laid out before a single day had passed. How precious are your thoughts about me...I can't even count them; they outnumber the grains of sand! And when I wake up, you are still with me!'. You're unique - and so is God's plan for you. It's encouraging to read stories and listen to great achievers and think, 'If they can do it, so can I!' However, the

2 secret is to learn from others without trying to duplicate them. It's not enough to have a good idea; it must be the will of God. You don't get to decide what your vision will be; you discover it 3 by seeking God for direction. And His Word says He will give it to you: 'Your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, "This is the way, walk in it," whenever you turn to the right hand or 5 whenever you turn to the left'. That way you know it's 'from the mouth of the LORD'.

Paul believed he was doing God's will by imprisoning and killing Christians. And when he discovered his true calling, it was in a dramatic way. 'As he journeyed he came near Damascus, and suddenly a light shone around him from heaven. Then he fell to the ground, and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?" And he said, "Who are You, Lord?" Then the Lord said, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. It is hard for you to kick against the goads." So he, trembling and astonished, said, "Lord, what do You want me to do?" Then the Lord said to him, "Arise and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do". That day his ministry began; one that was destined to change the world! And as his life neared its end, he could say, 'I was not disobedient to the heavenly vision'. Your vision must not be born out of your need to impress others or be like them. You're called to do God's will, not your own or someone else's. The Bible says, 'Ephraim [was] oppressed and broken in judgment, because he willingly walked by human precept'. Your vision must be the result of divine guidance and not 'human precept'. You must be able to pray, 'Lord, you gave me this vision, and I'm trusting you to provide what I need.' The apostle John writes, 'This is the confidence...we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us'.

Maybe you think because you haven't been to a Christian college or Seminary that God would never give a vision to someone like you. But you would be mistaken. The Bible says this: 'There was a certain disciple at Damascus named Ananias; and to him the Lord said in a vision, "Ananias." And he said, "Here I am, Lord." So the Lord said to him, "Arise and go to the street called Straight, and inquire at the house of Judas for one called Saul of Tarsus, for behold, he is praying. And in a vision he has seen a man named Ananias coming in and putting his hand on him, so that he might receive his sight."...And Ananias went his way and entered the house; and laying his hands on him he said. "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you came, has sent me that you may receive your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit." Immediately there fell from his eyes something like scales, and he received his sight at once; and he arose and was baptized. So when he had received food, he was strengthened'. And who exactly was Ananias? The right man, in the right place, at the right time, with the right attitude! And God used him to lead the apostle Paul to Christ. Pretty impressive, eh? But what's interesting is this: after that, Ananias is never mentioned again in Scripture. Bottom line: he was a 'nobody' who played a key role in God's plan. And if God gave Ananias a vision and used him greatly - He will do the same for you.

"Raised from the Dust"

Psalm 113 says: "[The Lord] raises the poor from the dust..."

1) The Lord raises the poor with His PRIDE.

⁴ Hear this, you who trample the needy and do away with the poor of the land, ⁵ saying, "When will the New Moon be over that we may sell grain, and the Sabbath be ended that we may market wheat?"— skimping on the measure, boosting the price and cheating with dis-honest scales, ⁶ buying the poor with silver and the needy for a pair of sandals, selling even the sweepings with the wheat. ⁷ The Lord has sworn by himself, the Pride of Jacob: "I will never forget anything they have done. Amos 8:4-7

2) The Lord raises the poor with His <u>PEACE</u>.

I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—² for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. ³ This is good, and pleases God our Savior, ⁴ who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. ⁵ For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus. 1 Timothy 2:1-5

3) The Lord raises the poor with His PROPERTY.

Jesus told his disciples...¹⁰ "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much. ¹¹ So if you have not been trustworthy in handling worldly wealth, who will trust you with true riches? ¹² And if you have not been trustworthy with someone else's property, who will give you property of your own? ¹³ "No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money." ¹⁴ The Pharisees, who loved money, heard all this and were sneering at Jesus. ¹⁵ He said to them, "You are the ones who justify yourselves in the eyes of others, but God knows your hearts. What people value highly is detestable in God's sight. Luke 16:1, 10-15

Our mission as a Christian ministry is to serve schools, churches, and families in order to advance the success of children who have learning needs. Our vision as a ministry is to reach out to provide the opportunity for every child to receive specialized learning services.

As we look to the future, we know that there is great potential for growth. Studies show that one student in five has a learning challenge. The law guarantees these children a public education. For families that choose a Christian education, Lutheran Special Education Ministries is eager to partner with them and with churches to help meet their needs.

Lutheran Special Education Ministries provides resource room services, professional development, and educational support to churches and schools across the country. Our ministry's vision is to provide children the opportunity to grow academically and spiritually regardless of the challenges they may face. We're constantly looking at ways to grow our ministry by serving and supporting as many children, families and Christian communities as possible.

Here's how our combined gift this month can impact these children across the country:

\$25 allows LSEM to provide consultation service for students at schools that do not have an LSEM program but need expert advice and resources.

\$50 helps an LSEM teacher screen students for literacy and math difficulties in their classrooms. \$100 provides online instructional support in reading and/or math for students experiencing difficulty with basic skills.

\$500 equips an LSEM teacher with reading and math intervention curriculum for the school year for their classroom.
