"What Is the True Meaning of Christmas?"

Christmas truly is one of the most wonderful times of the year. For many, there are warm parties, cozy homes, fond traditions to celebrate, and gifts to be shared. It's a joyous time of celebration. However, sometimes we get lost in the season and forget the reason we celebrate it, to begin with. Among the hustle and bustle, our focus is lost and priorities are misaligned. Most people can tell you the origins of Christmas—that it's a remembrance of the birth of Christ. But either that's the extent of their knowledge or they lose sight of this in the busyness of the holiday. Why do we truly celebrate Christmas? Not Santa Claus, or the Christmas tree, or any other of the various traditions wrapped up into Christmas. Why do we celebrate this occasion—what is its true meaning?

The Birth of Jesus and Meaning of Christmas

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it

with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this." -Isaiah 9:6-7 (ESV)

For thousands of years mankind waited for the coming of Christ; they longed for their King to arrive and free them from oppression. The Old Testament is full of prophecies, including this one from Isaiah 9. The Bible is full of Scripture pointing directly to the One who would save mankind from their sins. When Isaiah described His coming, he described His coming as an infant. But this child would grow and establish a Kingdom of righteousness forevermore. When we celebrate Christmas, we are celebrating the moment in history when prophecy was fulfilled. God came to be with us.

Celebrating Christmas and Salvation in Jesus

Because when Jesus came, he also left us with the gift of salvation. His birth is significant because of His death. For thirty-three years Jesus lived a life free from sin so that He could be the perfect sacrificial lamb for the atonement of our sins. On Calvary, Christ paid the price and overcame death so that we could have victory over sin and condemnation. So, when that precious baby was born and placed in the manger, it wasn't just another birth. It was the beginning of God's redemptive plan for humanity. An act He didn't have to take part in but He chose to out of love.

True Meaning for Celebrating Christmas

This very act of humility and his choice to die on the cross is cause for bowed knees and lifted hands. I know the busyness of the season can cause time to fly and before we know it, the holiday has passed and we have forgotten to celebrate why we are celebrating it in the first place. But don't get sidetracked—get perspective. Choose reverence and give honor where honor is due.

Take time this holiday season to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas by glorifying the One who gave it all. A child was born in humble circumstances and his sacrificial death reflected the same, however, both were significant for humanity. Without the death of Christ, salvation isn't possible. So without His birth, neither is it possible. Jesus coming to Earth that night changed everything and it's a moment we should celebrate with all our hearts. Certainly, enjoy the parties and food and gifts, but don't forget to point your heart, family, and those around you to Christmas' true meaning: Christ came with a plan for our redemption.

Living Word Lutheran Church Council Meeting Notes

Tuesday, December 20,2022 @ 7 pm

Attendees: Neal H, Bob G, Paul H, Bill M, Jim M, Pastor John, Diana M, and Donna W for the transition team update part.

Meeting opened with prayer at 7:04 pm from Pastor John

The meeting was then turned over to Donna as she wanted to inform the council of what was going on with Christ Lutheran and Pastor Matt D. As of right now Christ would not know if they could partner with us financially until after their budget is redone in June. They would still like to partner with us in other ways. The transition team did have a zoom meeting with Pastor Matt D and were very happy with the conversation. Pastor Matt has informed the team what he is currently making and serving two churches right now. He is also very interested in working closer with Christ Lutheran. Bob had put together some figures based off what we would like to offer Pastor Matt and for how long we could afford it based off if only Living Word was paying everything. There was a lot of discussion between the council and Donna about the salary that the Transition Team would like to offer. They will continue to look at the numbers and would also try to have another meeting with Pastor Matt next week. Donna did ask that we have a congregation meeting on Sunday, January 8th after worship. This meeting would show the financials to the congregation and what we all feel is a reasonable package to offer. Once the congregation was comfortable with that then we would also ask for them to vote if we should work to extend a call to him. We are working to get a list of members who are qualified to vote so that we have enough people at the meeting to be able to vote. We would allow qualified members to also vote online. Donna will also reach out to Pastor Lee to see what his plans are as we know in the past he would like to fully retire at some point soon. After everyone was comfortable with the discussion Donna left the meeting.

Bob then went over the rest of the financials from November. We are up in offerings as of right now thanks to a very generous donation. Our attendance is 71 behind than last year. All other finances look ok. Bill is going to reach out to Vanco who we use for our online giving as those funds have not been added to our accounts yet.

Diana did let the council know we will have a 6th student starting the preschool in January. He will be coming 2 days a week.

We then talked about our fire alarm service and needing a company to come out to do a fire alarm inspection. We did change to reliable to fill our fire extinguishers, but their alarm company was expensive. Bill is going to reach out to find out the best company to come out and make sure we aren't getting double charged from a few companies.

We did talk about the winter storm coming. We talked about if the weather is bad on Friday allowing Bev to work from home if she is ok with that. Also, if the weather were to be bad on Saturday maybe canceling our Christmas eve service. This would be determined by Neal on Saturday morning.

We adjourned the meeting at 8:22 pm with a prayer from Pastor John.
