## "About God's Love and Character"

#### 1. We Can Always Have Confidence in the Lord

The first three verses stress the confidence that David had in the Lord. He begins in verse one with these words, "The Lord is my light and my salvation–whom shall I fear?" In verse two, David is almost bragging about his enemies being defeated. David then ends verse three with the words "though war break out against me, even then will I be confident." David's words are powerful. We may not be fighting battles like David, but we are fighting battles. Each day we fight temptation, greed, and lust. We fight to keep ourselves set apart from this world. In those battles, we experience our enemies rise against us with hurtful words or deeds. But we can brag that even though the enemies come, our Lord will defeat them. We can be confident that our God will never leave us. Despite the heaviness of David's situation, he was confident that God had the perfect plan for him. We can be confident too. God has the perfect plan for our lives, and no enemy will stand in God's way. <u>Hebrews 4:16</u> states "Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." David was approaching God's throne with confidence and so shall we. **2. God Desires for Us to Seek Him for Ourselves** 

In verses four through six, David is seeking the Lord. He is exclaiming his desire to commune with Him in the safety of his "sacred tent." David wants to sing, make music, and shout for joy in the presence of God. Ultimately, David is seeking joy that can only come from communing with the Lord.

John Piper wrote, "<u>Communion</u> with God is not merely *learning about* God but enjoying *fellowship with* God in the truth he reveals about himself." David expresses his desire to not only learn about God, but he wants to be with God in His temple and make music with the Lord. Today, God still wants His children to commune with Him. He wants us to read our Bibles and learn more about who He is. He wants to hear us praise him in word, song, and deed. When God created Adam and Eve and placed them in the Garden of Eden, He walked among them. God wanted to be with His creation and that includes you and I. God gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit so that we could commune daily with Him.

#### 3. God Will Never Forsake Us

David had spent many years fighting and running. Through it all, he never lost <u>faith</u> in God. He was confident that the God he served would never forsake him. Verses 9-10 of this psalm show David crying out for God to not turn His face from him. The last words David says in verse 10 are "the Lord will receive me." Our God will never leave nor forsake us. He has promised to never turn away from us. In <u>Philippians 1:6</u> we are told that the one that began a good work in us will carry it on to completion. No matter how bad our trials are or how hopeless we feel, God will not leave us. God is going to be present in your life, even when everyone else has turned their backs on you. David knew he was never alone on the battlefield or in the caves. We are never alone on our battlefields as well.

#### 4. God Is Trustworthy

Inevitably, we will face trials on this Earth. We will feel like we cannot handle anything else. Our patience begins to run dry and life seems hopeless. It is in these moments we can trust our God. Verse 14 speaks of waiting for the Lord. When we wait for something or someone, we are expressing our trust in that person or action. God is the only thing we can trust in. He has proven over and over that he will keep his promises. He will show up at just the right moment to rescue us. We can take that to the bank. Each time David was in a precarious situation, he could trust God to take care of it. God has not changed from the time of David. We worship the same God David did, and we can trust that same God. 

#### 3) I don't fear demons; the Lord is my <u>STRONGHOLD</u>.

<sup>12</sup> When Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, he withdrew to Galilee. <sup>13</sup> Leaving Nazareth, he went and lived in Capernaum,

which was by the lake in the area of Zebulun and Naphtali—<sup>14</sup> to fulfill what was said through the prophet Isaiah: <sup>15</sup> "Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the Way of the Sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles—<sup>16</sup> the people living in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned." <sup>17</sup> From that time on Jesus began to preach, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." <sup>18</sup> As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. <sup>21</sup> Going on from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John. They were in a boat with their father Zebedee, preparing their nets. Jesus called them, <sup>22</sup> and immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him. <sup>23</sup> Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness among the people. <sup>24</sup> News about him spread all over Syria, and people brought to him all who were ill with various diseases, those suffering severe pain, the demon-possessed, those having seizures, and the paralyzed; and he healed them. <sup>25</sup> Large crowds from Galilee, the Decapolis, Jerusalem, Judea and the region across the Jordan followed him. # **Council Meeting Notes**

Living Word Lutheran Church Church Council Meeting Notes Tuesday, January 17, 2023 @ 7pm

Attendees: Neal H, Jim M, Pastor John, Diana M, and Bill M

Meeting opened with prayer at 7:18 pm from Pastor John

We then went over financials. Bob had provided the financial sheets and Bill went through them with the council. We had a starting balance of \$69,742.89 and ended with just a little under \$73,000. The holidays did bring in some more offerings. We are still not reaching our offering goal that we had for our budget. This also goes for attendance as well. Jim has spoken with Carolyn W about the \$500 that she has in a designated fund. They have talked about some new banners for the church. The council loved this idea and would like to make sure we had a way to then pay tribute to her for the banners. Bill is still working with Vanco to get the preschool payments that are made on our website to be direct deposited into our bank instead of Bill having to write a check from that account and the depositing it into the preschool account. Diana did share that we could have 2 more students starting preschool in the coming weeks giving us 8 students. She did order some supplies for Valentine's Day and got some more snacks for preschool. Other than that, she doesn't see any big expenses. She did mention she would look into cost of sashes for the children for preschool graduation.

Diana then shared with the council a letter from Bob G from the transition team. We are still waiting for Pastor Dubensky's paper work to come through so that we could then extend call papers to him. He did share in the letter that he also has spoken with Pastor Johnson and that he is still positive about a partnership in the future. He did say that President Buss and Pastor Dubensky were going to be talking this week. That Pastor Johnson has also been talking with President Buss.

Neal then presented to the council a proposal to pay for Bev's health insurance especially with the budget not giving her a raise for the next 3 years. Pastor John made a motion and Bill and Neal, both seconded it. The council voted unanimously I. This is something that would be a great benefit for Bev, and she works very hard for the church. We then also discussed how she has applied for Social Security. We may need to pay Randy for cleaning instead of Bev to make sure she doesn't go over her allowed earnings. We will look into this and do anything we can to help Bev.

The only other topic we talked about was that Pastor Schauer made mention to Diana of our projector and the quality of it. Diana has the name of a person at the district who does tech help. Diana is going to call him out and see what we could do. Pastor Schauer made mention of a laser projector. Diana will call Kevin and have him come out one afternoon and they can discuss options and she will present the quotes to the council.

Meeting was then adjourned with prayer from Pastor John at 8:36 pm
