"Response to God's Blessings"

The psalmist, David, observed that when he was weak in faith or was out of God's will, his attitude caused him to not see God's hand in his life and things generally looked bad. However, when he was walking with God prayerfully and in peace, his attitude was positive and he saw God's hand in all that was around him. David asked that eternal question that every child of God (Christians) should ask every day: "What shall I render unto the Lord for all His benefits?" What is our attitude on days that nothing seems to go right? What about the days when we seem to be walking on clouds and nothing can go wrong?

I. JUST WHAT HAS GOD BLESSED US WITH?

A. God Has Given Us Our Very Existence

We have been born in the greatest time of all ages, surrounded with inventions, comforts, etc. We have been born in a country that is the grandest on earth, filled with opportunities, freedom, where everyone around the world wants to come and live. The family we have been born into could have been less fortunate, another nationality, different home/family conditions, a god-less family. God's Word is freely and openly preached without fear of any reprisal and it is being spread all over the world in person and via television, radio, and internet, never before in history has it been so possible to spread God's Word.

B. God's Care For Us

Millions through the centuries have died before ever reaching the age that we are today. Things could be so different in our personal lives, such as the comforts we enjoy, our house, our clothing, food, cars, education, vacations, hobbies, etc. We could be afflicted with over whelming trials and troubles of all sorts and descriptions. 






Greetings from Dear Friends

Mission of the Month

LUTHERAN CHURCH CHARITIES will be the mission of the month for April. I will have more information about LCC in the newsletter next week. Even though we are very familiar with all the work they do and how compassionately they use the Word to comfort and console others, LCC is always expanding their mercy and good work in many different ways, from helping clean up after natural disasters to comforting those who have suffered and endured tremendous losses.

LCC K-9 Comfort Dog Ministry was launched in August of 2008, and it is a national human-care ministry embracing the unique, calming nature and skills of purebred Golden Retrievers. The LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs are a bridge for compassionate ministry, opening doors for conversation about faith and creating opportunities to share the mercy, compassion, presence and proclamation of Jesus Christ. They serve everyday in the community in which they are places in times of disaster and crisis to bring comfort to all those affected, including first responders and the volunteers who serve them.





LCC Kare 9 Military Ministry is a ministry by veterans for veterans. They strive to serve our military veterans and their families. The Kare-9 Military Ministry dogs and their trained veteran handlers visit many places including VFWs, VA hospitals, Traumatic Brain Injury Care Centers, homes of veterans that are home bound, Expos, Vet Clinics and various other activities to help spread the mercy and compassion.

LCC K-9 Police Ministry handlers are law enforcement officers (current and former) who understand the unique challenges facing the law enforcement community. They bring the mercy, compassion, presence and proclamation of Jesus Christ to those who protect and serve, as well as their families. Crisis Response serves the law enforcement and family members in their time of need, by providing comfort following injuries, deaths



or major incidents. Ongoing Support is the K-9 visits (headquarters, substations and dispatch centers), provides assistance with department missions such as Christmas shopping with children, summer camps and public events, comforting crime victims prior to interviews, counseling or courtroom testimonies, and general support for department members and their families.



LCC Disaster Response Ministries coordinates deployment of trained volunteers for Disaster Response. When disasters strike; lives, homes, businesses, churches and more are affected. LCC L.E.R.T. volunteers respond quickly to serve people affected by a disaster. LCC teams are trained to work through local churches to serve their communities. LCC Disaster Response provides on-site and online (L.E.R.T.) basic training. Additional training includes expertise in the area of chainsaw, heavy equipment, debris removal, flood recovery, and emotional and spiritual care.

Hearts of Mercy and Compassion (HMC), Crosses for Losses provides a physical and spiritual symbol through the giving of hearts and crosses to families and friends who have suffered a loss or are experiencing the illness of a loved one. An HMC can also be given to celebrate a victory, honor service, as an expression of love, or to be an encouragement in the face of adversity. Given as a gift, each HMC provides the love and hope of Jesus through presence and prayer. Upon request, LCC, working though churches, can provide an HMC at no charge.



"Return to Your Rest"

Psalm 116:7 says: "*Return to your rest, my soul, for the Lord has been good to you.*" God invites you to return to your rest. How do we do so...?

1) <u>REPENT</u> in Jesus' name; you will <u>RECEIVE</u> God's Spirit.

³⁸ "<u>Repent</u> and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will <u>receive</u> the gift of the Holy Spirit." Acts 2:38

2) <u>REVERENCE</u> the Lamb, our <u>REDEEMER</u> from emptiness.

¹⁷Since you call on a Father who judges each person's work impartially, live out your time as foreigners here in <u>reverent</u> fear. ¹⁸For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were <u>redeemed</u> from the empty way of life [Greek "mataios"] handed down to you from your ancestors, ¹⁹ but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect. 1 Peter 1:17-19

3) <u>RECOGNIZE</u> God's "Logos"—His Word of <u>REVELATION</u>.

¹⁴They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. ¹⁵As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; ¹⁶ but they were kept from recognizing him. ¹⁷He asked them, "What are you discussing together as you walk along?" They stood still, their faces downcast. ¹⁸One of them, named Cleopas, asked him, "Are you the only one visiting Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?" ¹⁹ "What things?" he asked. "About Jesus of Nazareth," they replied. "He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. ²⁰The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; ²¹ but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place. ²²In addition, some of our women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning ²³ but didn't find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive. ²⁴Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but they did not see Jesus." ²⁵ He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" ²⁷And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself. ²⁸ As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus continued on as if he were going farther. ²⁹ But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. ³⁰ When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. ³¹ Then their eyes were opened and they *recognized* him, and he disappeared from their sight. ³² They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he ta
