"Regardless—Always Obey God"

The rewards of obedience are awesome, but sometimes the process is agonizing. 'Even though Jesus was God's Son, he learned obedience from the things he suffered. In this way, God qualified him'. Before God promotes you to a position of usefulness in His service, He qualifies you. We admire the faith of Abraham who took his son Isaac up Mount Moriah and laid him on the altar. But the story doesn't make sense until you read the first verse in the chapter: 'Now it came to pass after these things that God tested Abraham'. What did God test? His faith! His obedience! And when he passed the test, God told him, 'In blessing I will bless You, and in multiplying I will multiply Your seed' (Genesis 22:17).

Understand this: when you pray and ask God for success, you're inviting Him to test your faith and obedience. God probably won't test you at the same level He tested Jesus or Abraham. But it's the smaller tests that prepare you to handle the bigger assignments in God's kingdom. The obedience God desires from you today is obedience that rises above your feelings and circumstances and says, 'Yes, Lord!'

Job describes the rewards of obedience: 'If they obey and serve Him, they shall spend their days in prosperity'. John adds, 'Whatever we ask we receive from Him, because we keep His commandments and do those things that are pleasing in His sight'. But Paul describes the cost of obedience: 'We think you ought to know...about the trouble we went through in the province of Asia. We were crushed and overwhelmed beyond our ability to endure, and we thought we would never live through it. In fact, we expected to die. But as a result, we stopped relying on ourselves and learned to rely only on God, who raises the dead. And he did rescue us from mortal danger, and he will rescue us again. We have placed our confidence in him, and he will continue to rescue us'.

Notice the words 'He did rescue us...He will rescue us again...He will continue to rescue us'. God didn't lift Paul out of his trouble, He walked with him in it and brought him through it. You say, 'But I have asked God to help me understand the situation and He hasn't.' God doesn't owe us an explanation, but He promises us an exit strategy. 'No test or temptation that comes your way is beyond the course of what others have had to face. All you need to remember is that God will never let you down; he'll never let you be pushed past your limit; he'll always be there to help you come through it'. So the word for today is – obey God, regardless.

What God commands you to do, He will give you the grace to do. But that doesn't mean it will be easy. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were ordered by the king to be burned alive for refusing to worship his golden image. Notice their faith confession: 1) 'Our God…is able to deliver us'. They never doubted God's ability. 2) 'And he will deliver us'. They never doubted God's willingness. 3) 'But if not,…we will not…worship the golden image'. They never considered an alternative to obedience!

How did their story turn out? 'Then King Nebuchadnezzar was astonished...saying..."Did we not cast three men bound into the midst of the fire?" They answered and said to the king, "True, O king." "Look!" he answered, "I see four men loose, walking in the midst of the fire; and they are not hurt, and the form of the fourth is like the Son of God". What happened next? 'Then the king promoted Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego in the province of Babylon'.

We know it's hard sometimes, when God asks you to do something you don't want to do, or feel you can't do, He has your best interests in mind. When your children say, 'I can't do this, it's too hard,' do you change your mind and let them off the hook? No, you insist, because it's for their good. That's how God feels about you: 'Oh, that their hearts would be inclined to fear me and keep all my commands always, so that it might go well with them'.

Living Word News

GROWTH IN OUR ATTENDANCE this year. As many of you are aware we have been trying to grow our attendance for worship service, both in person and online. I know some of you think that we still only get about 20 people coming for service every week, but we actually have been doing much better this year. I ran some reports just to make sure I wasn't imaging it, and the numbers have increased substantially. So for the 10:00 am Sunday morning services, in 2022 from the beginning of January to the end of August our in person attendance total was 659 and we had 213 online viewers. This year till the end of August, the in person attendance total is 805 and there were 310 online viewers. That is a 22% increase for in person attendance and a 45% increase in online viewers. These numbers include only church members, including Pastor and Elaine, and they do not include any visitors or extended family members in these reports as we count them as guests. In other words, those totals are even higher. Thank you everyone for helping make this possible. Please keep up the excellent effort in this matter. We love seeing all of our church family and it's so rewarding to know that you haven't forgotten about us. As an added bonus, we also should be eligible for the growth initiative from the endowment fund which would help us tremendously. **Good work everyone!!**

PRAYER REQUEST for Pastor John as he has been in the long-term care facility of the Victorian Village. He is still having trouble with the blood clots. He still has a very strong heart and spirit. Pastor Schauer said that he visits with him every couple of weeks, and he was there a couple of weeks ago to do service and said that Pastor John seems to be doing a little better since he was taken off of the new medicines that he was on. SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICES has seen a bit of a change starting last month. The first Sunday of every month will be a traditional hymnal worship service and the third Sunday of the month will be an informal outreach service and the remaining Sundays will be the blended service that we currently have. This will be a trial basis for a 6 month period, at which time you will have a chance to express your favorites, suggest minor changes to either service and choose if we do this going forward or use one or the other or go back to the same service styles each week. We will be announcing this on our sign and on our website and Facebook page to see if we can get any visitors or new members.

CALL COMMITTEE is looking for anyone who would like to volunteer to join us in our ongoing process of calling a pastor. I have volunteered to join the committee going forward, but we would love to have more voices and input in this process. If you have ever thought that you might want your voice heard in this process, now is the time to act upon that desire. We met Wednesday evening with Pastor Schauer, our Visiting Circuit Pastor from Trinity Lutheran as he now has another list of potential pastors. This seems to be a much more interesting list this time. There are a total of 6 pastors that we can call to see if they are still interested or available to interview and discuss our pastoral needs.

PRESCHOOL started last week. She has 4 students now, one girl will start either later this month or next month in October after she turns three years old, and one student's little sister will join the class in February when she turns three also. Please help spread the word about our preschool, we have to make sure the preschool keeps growing, Diana will accept students throughout the school year, as soon as the child is three. The first week of school was amazing and filled with fun for the kids. This week they have been working on writing their name and practicing writing upper case letters and numbers.

9-17-23 Message Outline

"Forget Not All His Benefits"

1) Praise the Lord for all His good <u>INTENT</u>.

15 When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "What if Joseph holds a grudge against us and pays us back for all the wrongs we did to him?" ¹⁶ So they sent word to Joseph, saying, "Your father left these instructions before he died: ¹⁷ 'This is what you are to say to Joseph: I ask you to forgive your brothers the sins and the wrongs they committed in treating you so badly.' Now please forgive the sins of the servants of the God of your father." When their message came to him, Joseph wept. ¹⁸ His brothers then came and threw themselves down before him. "We are your slaves," they said. ¹⁹ But Joseph said to them, "Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God? ²⁰ You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives. ²¹ So then, don't be afraid. I will provide for you and your children." And he reassured them and spoke kindly to them.

2) Praise the Lord for all His glorious <u>JUDGMENTS</u>.

Accept the one whose faith is weak, without quarreling over disputable matters. ² One person's faith allows them to eat anything, but another, whose faith is weak, eats only vegetables. ³ The one who eats everything must not treat with contempt the one who does not, and the one who does not eat everything must not judge the one who does, for God has accepted them. ⁴ Who are you to judge someone else's servant? To their own master, servants stand or fall. And they will stand, for the Lord is able to make them stand. ⁵ One person considers one day more sacred than another; another considers every day alike. Each of them should be fully convinced in their own mind. ⁶ Whoever regards one day as special does so to the Lord. Whoever eats meat does so to the Lord, for they give thanks to God; and whoever abstains does so to the Lord and gives thanks to God. ⁷ For none of us lives for ourselves alone, and none of us dies for ourselves alone. ⁸ If we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord. ⁹ For this very reason, Christ died and returned to life so that he might be the Lord of both the dead and the living. ¹⁰ You, then, why do you judge your brother or sister? Or why do you treat them with contempt? For we will all stand before God's judgment seat. ¹¹ It is written: "As surely as I live,' says the Lord, 'every knee will bow before me; every tongue will acknowledge God.'" ¹² So then, each of us will give an account of ourselves to God.

3) Praise the Lord for all His gracious FORGIVENESS.

²¹ Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?" ²² Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times.

²³ "Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. ²⁴ As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand bags of gold was brought to him. ²⁵ Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt. ²⁶ "At this the servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.' ²⁷ The servant's master took pity on him, canceled the debt and let him go. ²⁸ "But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred silver coins. He grabbed him and began to choke him. 'Pay back what you owe me!' he demanded. ²⁹ "His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay it back.' ³⁰ "But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. ³¹ When the other servants saw what had happened, they were outraged and went and told their master everything that had happened. ³² "Then the master called the servant in. 'You wicked servant,' he said, 'I canceled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. ³³ Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?' ³⁴ In anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed. ³⁵ "This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart."
