"The Joy of Trusting in God"

As much as we feel life is stressful for us, stress is not unique to our lifetime. People in the past also had to deal with wars, diseases and epidemics, the death of children, constant dental and medical problems, and a host of other hardships. It's like the poster of the classic painting of Daniel in the Lion's Den with the caption, "Contrary to conventional wisdom, stress is not a 21st century phenomenon." The psalms reflect a variety of difficult and stressful life situations that are threatening and disturbing and even cause people to question God or their faith. Psalm 27 is a prayer and song about The Joy of Trusting in God. It begins with words of faith and confidence. One thing I asked of the Lord, that will I seek after: to live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the Lord, and to inquire in His temple. For he will hide me in his shelter in the day of trouble; He will conceal me under the cover of His tent; He will set me high on a rock. Now my head is lifted up above my enemies all around me, and I will offer in His tent sacrifices with shouts of joy; I will sing and make melody to the Lord. Hear, O Lord, when I cry aloud, be gracious to me and answer me! "Teach me your way, O Lord, and lead me on a level path because of my enemies. Do not give me up to the will of my adversaries, for false witnesses have risen against me, and they are breathing out violence. I believe that I shall see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the **living**.

Wait for the Lord; be strong, & let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord!" Psalm 27 is a favorite of mine and of many people because it eloquently and poignantly expresses a central focus of biblical faith, the joy of trusting in God in all circumstances. Psalm 27:1-6 is very similar to Psalm 23 and expresses fearless trust in God which enables David to the face the present and future calmly regardless of many threats. These words are spoken by someone who has faced a lot of hardships and received the Lord's help. All of us face situations and circumstances in life that might cause us to be fearful or afraid. You know what they are for you right now. Psalm 27 describes how God blesses those who put their hope and trust in the Lord. God is our light, salvation, and stronghold, the source of our confidence, the one who lifts us up and protects us and never leaves us. For David trusting God and remaining confident in the face of enemies, adversaries, and foes was truly a matter of life and death. One thing that stands out to me about Psalm 27 is that it pleads with God 5 times DO NOT. Because David's relationship with God is so important to him all of the things David does not want to happen are related to changing his relationship with the Lord for the worse. DO NOT hide your face from me. To "hide the face" is to turn it away with displeasure. Even

today when folks are mad at someone, sometimes we might look away or turn our back and "hide our face." This is a contrast to someone smiling at us in a friendly way. The favor or blessing of God is described in the Bible perhaps most famously in the blessing of Aaron, "May the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you, and may the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace."

DO NOT turn your servant away in anger, you who have been my help. Can you imagine being in the midst of something difficult and going to God about it and feeling like God turned you away? That hurts. It would be like going to the church on Sunday morning for worship and finding the building locked and a "closed" sign on the door. Again, people can act this way, someone may want to talk to us or us to them and the overture is rejected out of anger which only makes the damage to the relationship worse. In days that are past God has been his help. This is the reason why he prays and trusts that God will come to his aid once again. As Christians, we call the Lord our light and salvation and the stronghold of our life because of the deliverance from sin and death given in Jesus. I pray that God will help us all each and every day to trust the Lord in the midst of our troubles, tests, trials, and temptations.

## Living Word News

**GROWTH IN OUR ATTENDANCE** this year. As many of you are aware we have been trying to grow our attendance for worship service, both in person and online. I know some of you think that we still only get about 20 people coming for service every week, but we actually have been doing much better this year. I ran some reports just to make sure I wasn't imaging it, and the numbers have increased substantially. So for the 10:00 am Sunday morning services, in 2022 from the beginning of January to the end of August our in person attendance total was 659 and we had 213 online viewers. This year till the end of August, the in person attendance total is 805 and there were 310 online viewers. That is a 22% increase for in person attendance and a 45% increase in online viewers. These numbers include only church members, including Pastor and Elaine, and they do not include any visitors or extended family members in these reports as we count them as guests. In other words, those totals are even higher. Thank you everyone for helping make this possible. Please keep up the excellent effort in this matter. We love seeing all of our church family and it's so rewarding to know that you haven't forgotten about us. As an added bonus, we also should be eligible for the growth initiative from the endowment fund which would help us tremendously. **Good work everyone!!**

**CALL COMMITTEE** is looking for anyone who would like to volunteer to join us in our ongoing process of calling a pastor. I have volunteered to join the committee going forward, but we would love to have more voices and input in this process. If you have ever thought that you might want your voice heard in this process, now is the time to act upon that desire. We met Wednesday evening with Pastor Schauer, our Visiting Circuit Pastor from Trinity Lutheran as he now has another list of potential pastors. This seems to be a much more interesting list this time. There were a total of 6 pastors on that list. 2 are not interested in accepting a call at this time, we are waiting to hear from a couple more that Donna has called.

**PRESCHOOL** started this month. She has 4 students now, one girl will start next month in October after she turns three years old, and one student's little sister will be joining the class next month for a trial basis on Tuesdays. Please help spread the word about our preschool, we have to make sure the preschool keeps growing, Diana will accept students throughout the school year, as soon as the child is three. The first week of school was amazing and filled with fun for the kids. This week they have been working on writing their name and practicing writing upper case letters and numbers.

**COUNCIL MEETING** was at 7:00pm this past Thursday night. They discussed the financials, preschool and updates from the transition team, amongst other subjects. ## Council Meeting Notes

Living Word Lutheran Church Council Meeting Notes Thursday, September 21, 2023 @ 7 PM

Attendees: Bill M, Ken M, Phil H, and Diana M

The meeting was opened with prayer at 7:14 p.m. by Phil. We then began with our financial portion of the meeting. Bill was able to get us a new supplier for our electricity to cut the cost down to .8 cents a kilowatt. We were also able to get a refund of \$1,500 from our previous supplier as well. He is going to look into a few options to help us save on our natural gas as well. We did have an alarming water bill. Normally our water bills are around \$70 to \$80 and our last one was a little over \$500. Bill called Orland Park and was able to get a more detailed graph that shows that during the Memorial Day weekend and the last week in June, we were going through tons of water. We discussed this could have been around the time of our pipe issue in the bathroom. He is going to make sure that all water mains for the outside are turned off just in case someone is using our outside water. Diana did mention that one day someone who rides around on a hoverboard came to the church, plugged their board in to charge, and left. He came back but we didn't get to see his license plate. Diana did state she would really like to get a few more cameras. We may need a booster, but we need one by the garage to really be able to catch license plates and could use one in front of the church and even on the other side by the church kitchen. Sometimes one camera doesn't pick things up so would be nice to have a few to better our chances of not missing anything. Bill said he would be in favor of getting more cameras. Bill also mentioned that Neal knows a tax accountant who did some accounting work for St. Matthews and was able to get some Covid relief funds for their church. Bill gave the accountant the information he needed to look into that for our church as well. Diana asked Bill if he would still need monthly Excel spreadsheets for preschool tuition. He said not really but to let him know if we got a special donation so he could make note of that. For the month of September, we got tuition for 4 students and a donation check of \$1,000. Everyone was then fine with the rest of the finances, so we moved to the next topic.

The next topic was preschool. Diana did say she will need to buy snacks next month but other than that didn't see any extra expenses. She mentioned that one family, their daughter already attends, and their second daughter will turn 3 at the end of February and will join. The family had expressed interest in whether it was allowed to send their daughter early or even just on Tuesdays while we only have 2 students right now. Unfortunately, due to our licensing under Trinity allowing a child under 3 would be considered more daycare and not able to do it. Diana did mention that one little girl asked why she didn't get to come all 3 days and so Diana did speak with her parents, and they are going to look into seeing if their schedule would allow them to let her come all 3 days. We will have our 5<sup>th</sup> student start the 1<sup>st</sup> week of October. That concluded our discussion on preschool.

Diana then informed everyone about the call committee. We were given 6 names from the district. Donna called all 6 and 3 were not interested in a call at this time. One pastor from IA said he wasn't really looking for a call but was also always open to hearing where God may be calling them. The call committee is working to get some dates available to talk with him. We have another pastor from GA who has not returned Donna's two calls yet. The 3rd one is from IL and praying on some things right now and would like Donna to call him back next week. He is also an SMP. Diana did reach out to the district to say that the list we got may not in fact bring us our future pastor and that can they work on another list for us. She also asked about seminary students how many are graduating and what our chances would be to get one if the congregation wanted to go that route. She also asked about pastors who may be looking for a dual parish or partnering as the partnership with Christ is at a standstill. Michelle from the district said she would be meeting with President Buss on Wednesday and get back to her. Diana will follow up with her on Tuesday if she has not heard back from them. Ken did say he would be willing to help if he could with the call committee. Diana said she would keep him up to date and let him know if we get any dates scheduled with pastors so that he could attend those meetings.

Diana then asked if there were any other topics and Bill said he would not be able to attend next month's meeting on October 19<sup>th</sup>, so the council agreed to meet on Wednesday, October 18<sup>th</sup> instead. We briefly spoke about Pastor Lee and as of right now, he should still be around, but things can change day by day. The meeting was adjourned at 8:12pm with prayer from Bill.

#### "Whom Shall I Fear?"

Psalm 27: 'The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear?'

#### I AM NOT AFRAID BECAUSE...

1) ...the Lord is both <u>NEAR</u> & <u>FAR</u>.

<sup>6</sup> Seek the Lord while he may be found; call on him while he is near. <sup>7</sup> Let the wicked forsake their ways and the unrighteous their thoughts. Let them turn to the Lord, and he will have mercy on them, and to our God, for he will freely pardon. 8 "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord. <sup>9</sup> "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts. Isaiah 55:6-9

2) ...God preserves me in both <u>LIFE</u> & <u>DEATH</u>.

12 Now I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that what has happened to me has actually served to advance the gospel. 13 As a result, it has become clear throughout the whole palace guard and to everyone else that I am in chains for Christ. 14 And because of my chains, most of the brothers and sisters have become confident in the Lord and dare all the more to proclaim the gospel without fear. ... 19 For I know that through your prayers and God's provision of the Spirit of Jesus Christ what has happened to me will turn out for my deliverance. <sup>20</sup> I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. <sup>21</sup> For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. <sup>22</sup> If I am to go on living in the body, this will mean fruitful labor for me. Yet what shall I choose? I do not know! <sup>23</sup> I am torn be-tween the two: I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far; <sup>24</sup> but it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body. <sup>25</sup> Convinced of this, I know that I will remain, and I will continue with all of you for your progress and joy in the faith, <sup>26</sup> so that through my being with you again your boasting in Christ Jesus will abound on account of me. <sup>27</sup> Whatever happens, conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ. Then, whether I come and see you or only hear about you in my absence, I will know that you stand firm in the one Spirit, striving together as one for the faith of the gospel <sup>28</sup>/<sub>2</sub> without being frightened in any way by those who oppose you. This is a sign to them that they will be destroyed, but that you will be saved—and that by God. <sup>29</sup> For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe in him, but also to suffer for him, <sup>30</sup> since you are going through the same struggle you saw I had, and now hear that I still have. Philippians 1:12-14 & 19-30

#### 3) ...the kingdom of heaven is for both FIRST & LAST.

"For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard. <sup>2</sup>He agreed to pay them a denarius for the day and sent them into his vineyard. <sup>3</sup> "About nine in the morning he went out and saw others standing in the marketplace doing nothing. <sup>4</sup>He told them, 'You also go and work in my vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right. 5 So they went. He went out again about noon and about three in the afternoon and did the same thing. <sup>6</sup> About five in the afternoon he went out and found still others standing around. He asked them, 'Why have you been standing here all day long doing nothing?' 7""Because no one has hired us,' they answered. "He said to them, 'You also go and work in my vineyard.' 8 "When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Call the workers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last ones hired and going on to the first.' "The workers who were hired about five in the afternoon came and each received a denarius. <sup>10</sup> So when those came who were hired first, they expected to receive more. But each one of them also received a denarius. 11 When they received it, they began to grumble against the landowner. 12 'These who were hired last worked only one hour,' they said, 'and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the work and the heat of the day.' <sup>13</sup> "But he answered one of them, 'I am not being unfair to you, friend. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius? <sup>14</sup> Take your pay and go. I want to give the one who was hired last the same as I gave you. <sup>15</sup> Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?' <sup>16</sup> "So the last will be first, and the first will be last." Matthew 20:1-16
