### "Jesus in Psalm 80"

When we think of great passages in the Psalms which find their climax and fulfillment in Jesus Christ, Psalm 80 deserves its place as one of the great messianic psalms in the Old Testament, even though you may never have preached on it. If you need a sermon to have in your back pocket for one of those weeks when you have two funerals and a wedding, then this article is ready to jump into your back pocket!

There are four key images which are used in this Psalm to describe God's redemptive provision for his people: Shepherd, Vine, Son of Man at your Right Hand, and the "Face" of God. The Psalm opens with the beautiful picture of God as the "shepherd of Israel" who leads His people "like a flock." This is an amazing image which is unusual since much of the imagery of God in the Old Testament pictures God enthroned or His voice thundering over Mount Sinai. Here, we see a tenderness and intimacy which finds its greatest fulfillment in Jesus Christ who declares, "I am the good shepherd who lays down his life for the sheep". There is no greater sign of God as shepherd than Jesus laying down his life for us and leading us from the barrenness of our sinful wilderness to the green pastures of new life in Him.

Psalm 80 also invokes the imagery of the vine. In the Psalm, the vine represents Israel which has been nourished by God. He brought the vine out of Egypt, and he planted it in a land where it could grow and flourish. Yet, the vine has been cut down and ravaged and burned through Israel's disobedience. The Old Testament first embraces the idea that although Israel has sinned, there was a remnant who followed the Lord. However, gradually, the remnant became smaller until no one was left. There was none who were found faithful. It is another picture of the predicament we are in apart from God's intervention. Finally, Jesus came into the world. He fully embodied Israel. He alone is the true and only Israelite who kept the covenant and loved God with all His heart and mind. It is as the true Israelite that He declares, "I am the true vine". There is no hope for fruitfulness unless we, the branches, abide in Him. He alone is the source of our nourishment and life.

Psalm 80 goes on to hint at this great messianic hope when it declares that in the face of Israel's tragic, lamentable state, their hope is that God would "rest on the man at your right hand, the son of man you have raised up for yourself". Even the great kings of Israel who represented God's "right hand" in the world, failed. It would be great David's greater Son, Jesus Christ, who would stand as God's man at his right hand, the "son of man" who would represent all of humanity in the incarnation. He becomes God's great victor who exercises God's kingly rule in the world.

Finally, Psalm 80 has a beautiful, reoccurring refrain which comes with slight variations in verses 3 and 7. The one common thread in these refrains is the phrase "make your face to shine upon us." You will recall that this is drawn from that prayer of blessing found in Numbers 6:24-26: "The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." The incarnation is that great knot which ties heaven and earth together. It is in Jesus Christ, the Incarnate One, that we truly and definitively see the "face of God" shining upon us.

Psalm 80 is filled with images which roll upon the reader, one after the other. Each one is rich in imagery and symbolism. Each one draws on dozens of texts in the Old Testament which would have been familiar to those early singers of this Psalm. But, we know that they could only see in part, what has now been made fully known in Jesus Christ. He is our Good Shepherd. He is the True Vine. He is the Son of Man who sits at the Father's right hand. He is the Face of God which turns to us in the gospel and gives us the light of the revelation of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

**CHANGE IN SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICES** are in full swing as we are getting used to the different formats. The first Sunday of every month will be a traditional hymnal worship service and the third Sunday of the month will usually be an informal outreach or praise service and the remaining Sundays will usually be the blended service that we currently have. This will be a trial basis for a 6 month period, which will end at the end of January, at which time you will have a chance to express your favorites, suggest minor changes to either service and choose if we do this going forward or use one or the other or go back to the same service styles each week. We will be announcing this on our sign and on our website and Facebook page to see if we can get any visitors or new members.

**CALL COMMITTEE** had a meeting with Pastor Ziemann a few weeks ago. We met with Pastor Prohl from Northern Illinois District to go over our call process and other options we have. We received a lot of information, Pastor Prohl was a very good listener and tried to answer all of our questions regarding certain processes and timeline issues. # 12-3-23 Message Outline

### "Come and Save Us!"

As Advent begins, we pray with Psalm 80: "Come and save us!"

#### 1) "Come DOWN and save us!"

Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down, that the mountains would tremble before you! <sup>2</sup> As when fire sets twigs ablaze and causes water to boil, come down to make your name known to your enemies and cause the nations to quake before you! <sup>3</sup> For when you did awesome things that we did not expect, you came down, and the mountains trembled before you. <sup>4</sup> Since ancient times no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who acts on behalf of those who wait for him. <sup>5</sup> You come to the help of those who gladly do right, who remember your ways. But when we continued to sin against them, you were angry. How then can we be saved? <sup>6</sup> All of us have become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous acts are like filthy rags; we all shrivel up like a leaf, and like the wind our sins sweep us away. <sup>7</sup> No one calls on your name or strives to lay hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us and have given us over to our sins. <sup>8</sup> Yet you, LORD, are our Father. We are the clay, you are the potter; we are all the work of your hand. <sup>9</sup> Do not be angry beyond measure, LORD; do not remember our sins forever. Oh, look on us, we pray, for we are all your people.

Isaiah 64:1-9

#### 2) "Come IN and save us!"

<sup>3</sup> Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>4</sup> I always thank my God for you because of his grace given you in Christ Jesus. <sup>5</sup> For in him you have been enriched in every way—with all kinds of speech and with all knowledge— <sup>6</sup> God thus confirming our testimony about Christ among you. <sup>7</sup> Therefore you do not lack any spiritual gift as you eagerly wait for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed. <sup>8</sup> He will also keep you firm to the end, so that you will be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>9</sup> God is faithful, who has called you into fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

1 Corinthians 1:3-9

#### 3) "Come SOON and save us!"

<sup>24</sup>"But in those days, following that distress, "the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; <sup>25</sup> the stars will fall from the sky, and the heavenly bodies will be shaken.' <sup>26</sup> "At that time people will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory. <sup>27</sup> And he will send his angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of the heavens. <sup>28</sup> "Now learn this lesson from the fig tree: As soon as its twigs get tender and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. <sup>29</sup> Even so, when you see these things happening, you know that it is near, right at the door. <sup>30</sup> Truly I tell you, this generation will certainly not pass away until all these things have happened. <sup>31</sup> Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away. <sup>32</sup> "But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. <sup>33</sup> Be on guard! Be alert! You do not know when that time will come. <sup>34</sup> It's like a man going away: He leaves his house and puts his servants in charge, each with their assigned task, and tells the one at the door to keep watch. <sup>35</sup> "Therefore keep watch because you do not know when the owner of the house will come back—whether in the evening, or at midnight, or when the rooster crows, or at dawn. <sup>36</sup> If he comes suddenly, do not let him find you sleeping. <sup>37</sup> What I say to you, I say to everyone: 'Watch!'"

## Council Meeting Notes

Council Meeting Notes

Sunday, November 26, 2023, at 11:30 a.m.

Attendees: Diana M, Bill M, Phil H, Ken M, and Neal H
Call committee members Bev H and Donna W

The meeting opened with prayer by Phil at 11:57 a.m.

The 1st topic was our financials and Neal stated he and Ken will be getting together to work on a budget. This will also help with knowing how much we can really afford to call a pastor. There were not many out-of-the-ordinary payments, but we did pay the \$2,000 to the tax accountant to get our refund checks from the federal government. We also had to pay Forest Alarm \$219.00 to replace our battery. Our electricity went down. Neal did inform the council Bev's health insurance did go up by \$75 and the council was ok with paying that increase. Neal did say that he and Ken would work on 2 budgets one that would be if we still have Pastor Lee and one if we were to call a new pastor. Neal made a motion to approve all the bills for October and Diana 2nd it was unanimous. Bill also asked that there be a motion to move \$3,000 from a special donation to preschool and \$3,000 to the new pastor fund which was specified by the person who donated the money. Diana 2nd and it was unanimous.

We then talked about the call process with Pastor Ziemann. The call committee feels confident in placing a call to him and would like to know what the council would like to offer him as a salary. This is what Neal and Ken will be working on. It was mentioned that Pastor Ziemann has the Concordia package and that we know he will need a family plan. The cost is starting to be around \$28,000 and we would pay 80% he would need to pay 20%. Donna is going to look into the specific plans to share with the council to see coverage. We also talked about our meeting with Pastor Price from Trinity Lisle. We really liked a lot of his ideas and would pray he could help us with volunteers to do some of the family projects we would like to have in the future. We agreed we don't want to do a replant which would include having to close the church for a while. We feel that the core people would most likely leave the church and when the church opened again it would be a totally different church.

We will be having a congregation meeting on Sunday, December 10<sup>th</sup> to present Pastor Ziemann to the congregation and also talk about the budget. Donna is going to reach out to Pastor Ziemann to let him know what we are doing and make sure he is still open to the call process with us. The following Sunday the 17<sup>th</sup> members will vote by just putting a ballot in the box if they feel comfortable in the call committee sending call papers to Pastor Ziemann.

Diana did mention that either one of the elders or Neal would need to ask that Pastor Lee take off December 17<sup>th</sup> as the preschool would be performing and some of the families would prefer him not be here.

Diana would also be reaching out to the district to ask for a mission insight report something that Pastor Price mentioned to us that helps see the needs of the community around us.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Phil at 1:09 p.m.
