### "A Model for Prayer"

In Psalm 62:8, David writes, "Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us" (Psalm 62:8). In this short verse David instructs God's people on prayer with an undivided heart, the kind of prayer God rewards.

First, this kind of prayer begins with a call to total trust in God, a trust which is "at all times." The emphasis is not upon the *level* of trust, but rather the constancy of trust and the worthiness of the Person trusted in. A trust which is able to endure at all times can only be a trust focused and founded on the God of salvation. This is why in the verse before David exclaims that "He only is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken. On God rests my salvation and my glory; my mighty rock, my refuge is God." God's solidity leads to David's constancy in trust. David trusts the reliable God and constantly rests on his strength.

And this leads to the second point about godly prayer. It is not only constant, it is also honest. That is, it is a prayer offered in integrity of heart. David instructs God's people in verse 8 to, "pour out your heart before him". The consequence of fixing your heart to trust in God is to *pour out* your heart in prayer. For David, trusting in God *is* praying to God. And it is not just any old kind of prayer but a prayer which comes from deep within the heart. This is why we can say that God looks at the *sincerity* and *heartiness* of prayer. Who can read Psalm 34 and not hear the sincerity of David's heart when he says that he "cried and the Lord heard him... Oh taste and see that the Lord is good!" Or in Psalm 16 when he opens his heart before the Lord and proclaims "that my heart is glad, and *my whole being rejoices!*" For David, true prayer requires the whole heart to be engaged.

Not only does he instruct the godly to *constantly* pour out their *whole* heart in prayer, but specifically, to do so "before him". This is a prayer that is firmly trusting in God, pouring out the heart to God, and aware of being in God's presence. This brings to mind the scene in Isaiah 6. Isaiah is brought before the LORD in his temple and throne-room. And the effect of this drives Isaiah, in humility, to be focused completely upon God. The thrice holy, majestic, and terrifying Lord demands complete attention. And it is this kind of focus to which David points his readers. Godly prayer is a constant and honest opening of the heart before God himself. Or that we have "a humbled and contrite heart and undivided in its focus."

But David doesn't end there. He shows us lastly that his prayer before God recognizes God as a refuge. God is a saving God. David goes from the terrifying presence of God to the comforting mercy and grace of God; a God who loves to save and sustain in protective refuge. Earlier in the Psalm David wrote that God "is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be greatly shaken." And he returns to this comforting truth. It is finally in the awareness of God's tender mercy and sovereign protection that true prayer begins to fly. As a young son flies to his Father in the midst of hurt or fear, so too do the sons of God fly to a Sovereign Father who promises to work out all things for those who love Him.

Psalm 62:8 gives believers a beautiful picture of prayer. It is prayer which stems from continual trust in a trustworthy God. It is prayer which pours out the whole heart before God. And it is prayer which knows God as Savior, and which rests in the refuge of his mercies.

## Council Meeting Notes

Living Word Lutheran Church
Council Meeting Notes
Thursday, January 18, 2024, at 7 pm

Attendees: Bill M, Neal H, Ken M, Paul H, Phil H, and Diana M

The meeting was opened with prayer by Phil at 7:12 pm.

The first topic was financials for December and January. Thanks to Christmas we had a good increase in offerings. As of right now, we have \$91,554.96 in general funds, \$63,446.20 in designated funds, and \$6,387.10 in the preschool fund. Neal will look into when our contract is up for our copier because he has seen refurbished ones a lot cheaper than what we pay a month for ours. He would talk with Bey to see what features we need and use currently. Diana mentioned that our technology fund doesn't have much left in it, so the general fund will need to take over those costs. Right now, we have been paying for Zoom, Microsoft Office, Stream yard, and Our Church.com out of the technology fund but these are things we need to continue. Also, Bev's computer is starting to make strange noises and run very slowly so we may need to look into upgrading that soon. Paul was going to look at that as well as the projector in the preschool room that is not working. We also talked about how Pastor Lee should be getting a check for \$205 a month to pay for his health insurance instead of that being included in his pay with ADP as he should not be getting taxed on that. Our water bill is now back to what we normally were paying. Bill mentioned that the general fund did pay for VBS supplies for an invoice that was never paid for. Diana motioned that \$390.11 should be transferred from the VBS fund to the general fund. Phil 2<sup>nd</sup> and it was voted unanimously. Neal also mentioned that since we had more in our general fund than last year we should move some money over to the growth fund which could help pay for a full-time pastor. We discussed as a council that moving some money would be ok and can monitor donations and move more over later if things are still going well. Ken motioned that we move \$11,000 to the growth-designated fund from the general fund. Diana 2<sup>nd</sup> and the council voted unanimously. We also got a \$50 donation on December 17th that should go to preschool, so Ken made a motion to move the \$50 from general to preschool Neal 2<sup>nd</sup> and the council voted unanimously. That concluded the financial portion.

Diana mentioned that we have a tour for preschool next Thursday and talking with another family. We do need to think about an open house as schools are already starting to register for the 2024/2025 school year. Diana did mention that if we wanted to look into a 5-day-a-week school year, we would need to hire someone for 2 out of the 5 days as in the spring of 2025 Diana will have to do student teaching and will not be available. We would also have to look into the DCFS part of upping our license to more hours of operating. Ken did mention talking with Trinity Lisle about having someone help us with that. Diana said she could also talk to Lois from the District who is coming to visit on Thursday as well.

Diana then talked about having an Easter egg hunt and VBS again. She already had two families ask when our VBS would be, and she let them know she would know towards the end of February depending on if Pastor Ziemann accepts our call. Neal had also mentioned how he liked the evening once-a-week VBS that Trinity Lisle has done and would like to try that. Diana mentioned that we should probably still do our normal VBS but then offer the family evening VBS after. She feels most of her families who attend now are looking for our 3 hours a day for one-week VBS for their child. The council seemed to agree on that. Neal will talk with Pastor Price about finding out more about the family evening VBS. Diana asked that we have February be Children's Ministry for Mission of the Month to help pay for Easter eggs and any leftover money goes to VBS after.

We then talked about Pastor Ziemann coming and also to talk with him about his health insurance policy and the one that we can offer him. We did agree that we could pay his health insurance 100% since we aren't offering other benefits like car and housing allowances.

We briefly talked about the surveys about the worship styles that we tried out. It seems that no one really liked the informal service and is ok with the blended or traditional worship services. We are thinking that the 1st Sunday will be a traditional service and the rest blended. This could also be changed if Pastor Ziemann were to accept our call and how he would prefer to lead worship. We all agreed that this would be something the congregation and Pastor Ziemann would have to talk about and work through.

The meeting was adjourned with a prayer from Phil at 8:30 pm.

## 1-14-2024 Message Outline

#### "From Him"

Psalm 62 says: "Truly my soul finds rest in God; my salvation comes from him." From him comes all we need to do all he asks...

#### 1) We share the proclamation from God: "GO."

Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time: <sup>2</sup> "Go to the great city of Nineveh and proclaim to it the message I give you." <sup>3</sup> Jonah obeyed the word of the LORD and went to Nineveh. Now Nineveh was a very large city; it took three days to go through it. <sup>4</sup> Jonah began by going a day's journey into the city, proclaiming, "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overthrown." <sup>5</sup> The Ninevites believed God. A fast was proclaimed, and all of them, from the greatest to the least, put on sackcloth. ... <sup>10</sup> When God saw what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, he relented and did not bring on them the destruction he had threatened. 2) We honor our priorities from God: "<u>TIME IS SHORT</u>."

29 What I mean, brothers and sisters, is that the time is short. From now on those who have wives should live as if they do not; <sup>30</sup> those who mourn, as if they did not; those who are happy, as if they were not; those who buy something, as if it were not theirs to keep; <sup>31</sup> those who use the things of the world, as if not engrossed in them.
