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"Jesus Is Our Teacher" Throughout John's biography of Jesus, a clear theme emerges: "Who is this guy?" The answer comes in the form of the famous "I Am" statements. Jesus describes himself in imagistic terms to be "the bread of life ... the resurrection and the life ... the light." In each of these ontological statements, Jesus employs the important Greek phrase ego eimi, "I am," which hearkens back to the story of Moses and his interaction with the I am. And in case anyone is confused as to whether Jesus means to make such a blasphemous claim, he later boldly declares that "before Abraham was, I Am." These statements of identity clue us in to who Jesus is—he is life. He is nourishment. He is God. Skilled scholars have numbered the "I Am" statements to seven. But careful readers will notice that there are more than seven, far more. And one of them has lacked the attention that it deserves. In John 13, after having washed his disciples' feet, Jesus says, "You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am". This I Am statement—again employing ego eimi—misses our count because, for one, it's not imagistic like "bread" or "light." Secondly, it's not a unique claim. Of course Jesus is a teacher; everyone called him "Teacher." Unlike the other statements, saying he's a "teacher" doesn't highlight Jesus' deity. Or does it? After all, Israel has many teachers, but the main one, the teacher, is YHWH himself. As the Psalmist says, "Make me to know your ways, O YHWH; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all the day long". By claiming the moniker of "teacher," Jesus is certainly aligning himself with God, the great instructor of sinners. Consider Jesus' appearance to Mary after the resurrection. At first, she doesn't recognize him, thinking him to be one of the gardeners. But after he says her name, she realizes who he is: "Rabboni, which in Aramaic means teacher". Central to Jesus' identity, just as important as his being the resurrection or the good shepherd or the vine, is his being our teacher.

Learning What To Do Next

Today, many Christians have a form of Christianity in which Jesus is their savior, perhaps even their "lord." But he is not their teacher-that is, he doesn't tell them what to do, guide them through life, or correct them when wrong. The commands of Jesus are not taken seriously, nor are they required for belief. No, that would be "works," or worse, "legalism." There's a history to this. The Protestant Reformation rightly placed the locus of salvation with God himself. Man cannot save; only God can. But one of the caricatures of Protestant preaching today is that "you don't need to do anything to be saved ... Jesus has done it all." The result is an entire generation of Christians who prayed a prayer of faith alone but who didn't learn what to do next. The Bible doesn't commend this approach. When the listeners asked Peter, "What must we do to be saved?" he didn't say, "Nothing! Jesus did it all! Isn't that great news?" No, he said, "Repent and be baptized ..." and then they "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching". In other words, change your beliefs and allegiances, give up living for yourself, join God's family, receive his forgiveness, and start following the commands of Jesus. **Doing What We Have Learned**

This is why the apostles can so easily move between talking about God's grace and mercy and forgiveness to talking about our obedience and response, and obedience and works. To the apostles, these things were not separable into tidy categories like "justification" and "sanctification." No, it is all the work of God. Even me learning to obey his teachings is his work, because after all, he's the teacher! In the passage from John 13 cited above, Jesus goes on to say, "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet". His point is that real "faith" looks like obedience to his teachings. If Jesus is not our teacher, then he's not really our lord at all; and he's likely not our savior. "Only the obedient truly believe, and only the believing truly obey." The Blessing Inherent in Both

If we don't regard Jesus' primary identity as our teacher, we will miss out on perhaps the most significant part of his relationship to us. Jesus came to seek and save, to die on the cross for sins, to grant forgiveness, and to give eternal life. He also came to instruct us in how we should live. That's what a teacher—or in the Jewish context, a Rabbi—does. He forms a community of followers who learn how God designed them to live.

Living Word Council Meeting

Living Word Lutheran Church Council Notes Thursday, February 15, 2024, at 7pm

Attendees- Diana M, Bill M, Phil H, Neal H, and Ken M

The meeting was opened with a prayer from Phil at 7:05 pm.

We began the meeting with financials. Bill did move over the \$11,000 we agreed on last meeting to the growth fund. Right now, in our general fund, we have \$79,462.99. Neal has talked with Proven about getting a copier instead of us paying a monthly fee for one. We also talked about how we may need to get a new phone for Bev's office. All other financials looked good.

Diana then let everyone know that the 8th preschooler will start on Feb 26th. She will also have a preschool open house on Saturday, April 13th from 11:00 to 12:30. She did have to buy a new potty seat for preschool as some of her smaller students struggle with our bigger toilets. She will need to buy snacks soon.

For our mission of the month, Children's Ministry Diana has purchased eggs for the Easter Egg hunt. So far, we have 59 kids signed up. She will still need to get candy for the eggs. She will also be ordering the VBS curriculum soon. The date has been set for July 22nd – 26th.

For the call committee update Diana has reached out to the district to get a new list of pastors so they will be working on that. Neal spoke with Pastor Schauer about doing an evaluation of the church for the district. He said that they have 27 SMPs graduating and 92 seminarians this year. Someone also came to Diana asking if we were able to change our constitution so that if we close our doors, we can have a say in where the money goes instead of giving it to the district. Neal said this is something he talked about to Pastor Whitby and Pastor Schauer when he became president, and the church was built with funds from the district so it is the districts and can't change it. This includes any funds in the bank accounts or endowment fund.

Pastor Lee would like to take some time off in the summer and also take Feb 25th. He will work with Bill on doing a sermon. As a council, we have agreed that if Pastor Lee is writing or working on part of a sermon for a service even if he is not going to be there, he will get ½ of his pay.

A few people have approached Diana about the services and how we should now vote on what services we do. It was previously mentioned that due to feedback from the surveys filled out, people did not like the informal service, and a few didn't seem to always want a traditional service. We had talked at the last meeting that we would just now do a traditional service on the 1st of the month and the rest blended. Diana mentioned that the reason people did not like the informal service was due to it not being what they thought it was going to look like. Diana brought up that maybe the sermon for an informal service could not have bullet points and just be more of a discussion sermon. The council agreed and Bill will speak with Pastor Lee about that. Bill will see if Pastor Lee could try and change that service up a little and give some people more time to experience that. We would inform the congregation that we are going back to the drawing board a little and will keep testing out the services and then the congregation will vote on what service they would like to see or attend.

Neal is having a company come out and look at placing a better security camera system around the church as the ones we have now are just not very reliable. This company could also change our fire alarm batteries.

Neal also let the council know that he will have someone come out and survey the property to see where all our property lines are. This way we can also make sure that the neighbor who has the trampoline is not on our property. Then we also know for sure where our property starts and ends.

Bill did say that Eleanor had made a donation and would like \$25 of that donation to go to the Children's Ministry. Diana made a motion that the \$25 be moved and Neal 2nd. The council voted unanimously.

Bill closed the meeting with prayer at 8:41 pm.
