"A Good Shepherd: Caring For the Needy"

Since the government didn't care for widows and orphans back in New Testament times, the church took on that responsibility. Unfortunately, bias raised its ugly head, and Jewish widows and orphans were given preferential treatment over Gentile widows and orphans. How did the church leaders respond? They could easily have dismissed it, like we so often do. They could have said, 'We're called to feed souls, not stomachs. We deal in matters of sin and salvation, not sandals and soup.'Instead, here is what they did. First, they called a meeting to resolve the problem (see Acts 6:2). They let every member know that their church took poverty seriously, and they were each personally responsible before God to do something about it. The Scripture doesn't endorse forced communism, but it clearly teaches Spirit-led volunteerism. Second, they assigned the problem to their brightest and best. They selected seven men – well respected, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom – and gave them this responsibility (see Acts 6:3). Instead of grooming our children for 'important' fields like medicine, law, politics, or government, let's teach them that caring for the needy is one of God's highest callings.

Why do 10 percent of the world's population go to bed hungry each night? Or seventeen thousand-plus children die every single day (one every five seconds) from malnutrition and preventable diseases when we can do something about it? No one can do everything, but God has called each of us to do something! 'Pure and genuine religion…means caring for orphans and widows in their distress and refusing to let world [systems] corrupt you [into believing that it's not your responsibility]' (James 1:27).

When he was a theology student, Jim Wallis and some of his classmates took scissors to the Bible and cut out every verse about poverty, wealth, justice, or oppression. And would you believe it, by the time they had finished, there were some two thousand verses lying on the floor! The fact is, when you cut concern for the poor from your Bible, you cut the heart right out of it! Here is one such verse: "He defended the cause of the poor and needy...so all went well. Is that not what it means to know me?" declares the Lord' (v. 16).

Jesus often quoted Scripture, but one occasion do we find Him selecting and reading from it.

And what portion did He choose to read publicly? 'The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor...to proclaim freedom for the prisoners...recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free'. Here was His to-do list: help for body and soul, strength for the physical and spiritual, and therapy for temporal and eternal.

Now, some people (albeit a minority) are poor because they're lazy and need to be taught that God's Word says, 'Those unwilling to work will not get to eat' (2 Thessalonians 3:10). But others are poor because parasites have weakened their bodies, or they spend six hours every day collecting water, or rebel armies have destroyed their farms, or disease has claimed their parents. These are the people God has assigned us to care for!

Three-quarters of the world's income ends up in the pockets of 20 percent of its population. Think of it this way: ten dairy farmers live in the same valley, and among them, they own ten cows. But the cows aren't evenly distributed, one cow to one farmer. It's more like this: two farmers own eight cows, while the other eight farmers share two cows. Does that seem right? The two farmers who own eight cows might easily say, 'I worked for my cows.' But the question is, what responsibility does God place on the 'haves' with regard to the 'have-nots'? First, that you allow yourself to feel concern and compassion. Second, that you get out of your comfort zone and do something about it. 'Blessed are those who have regard for the weak; the Lord delivers them in times of trouble. The Lord protects and preserves them – they are...blessed in the land – he does not give them over to the desire of their foes. The Lord sustains them on their sick-bed and restores them'. When you bless the poor, God blesses you.




VERSE OF THE MONTH The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction. *Proverbs 1:7*

Council Meeting Notes
Thursday, April 18, 2024 at 7 pm

Attendees: Bill M, Paul H, Phil H, Diana M, Ken M, and Neal H.

The meeting opened with a prayer from Phil at 7:10 pm.

The council went over all finances from general, designated, and preschool. Ken is going to look into other options for natural gas for the church. Neal is also having a meeting with Proven IT on Friday, April 19th to discuss buying a copier instead of us leasing one. Diana did make a motion for Bill to reimburse the general fund \$544.77 from the Sunday school fund for Easter egg supplies. Phile 2nd and it was voted unanimously. Neal asked the council to allow him to have someone come survey the lot for \$1,500 as we really need to know where our property lines are. The council all agreed to allow this.

Diana did let the council know she has 4 students for next year so far. Three of them will be 3 days a week and one is still undecided if they want to stay with 2 or go to 3. Bill will also be doing the service for the preschool graduation on Sunday, May 19th.

Diana did just let the council know we have 5 names from the district. They have all the information on the pastors and will meet again next Wednesday the 24th to discuss the pastors. Then Ken will call each pastor to see if they will be willing to speak with us. As we know some pastors don't know they are on the call list or don't want to move at this time.

We will be conducting a survey for the congregation to anonymously fill out to see how they feel the direction of the church is going and things they would like to see the church do. Neal will be contacting the district to get this set up so we can share the link and print out copies for people to fill out.

We will be hosting a movie night and inviting other churches in the area to join us to watch The Letter to the American Church. Neal has some books that he will give to the churches to see what the movie will be about. He will also get some books to sell after the movie if anyone else would like them. Neal has spoken with the district and they are ok with us showing this movie. Diana has made up a flyer to share. We will show the movie at 6:30 on May 31st.

Diana wanted to let everyone know that PASS in Tinley park reached out to partner with and will be our Mission of the Month for May. We will have a guest speaker on May 12 and will talk for about 10 to 15 minutes at the end of the service. The person who contacted her use to work together with Pastor Lange in the past. Phil will also be giving a Gideon presentation July 7th and Gideon will be our Mission of the Month for July.

Neal did mention he will need a check for the new cameras, fire, and security alarm system being put in on April 27th. The check will come from general and then will be reimbursed from designated funds.

"Praise the Lord!"

Psalm 150 says: "Praise the Lord!" Today our Scriptures tell us why...

1) Praise the Lord because the GOSPEL is for everyone.

²⁶Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Go south to the road—the desert road—that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." ²⁷ So he started out, and on his way he met an Ethiopian eunuch, an important official in charge of all the treasury of the Kandake (which means "queen of the Ethiopians"). This man had gone to Jerusalem to wor-ship, ²⁸ and on his way home was sitting in his chariot reading the Book of Isaiah the prophet. ²⁹ The Spirit told Philip, "Go to that chariot and stay near it." ³⁰ Then Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading Isaiah the prophet. "Do you understand what you are reading?" Philip asked. ³¹ "How can I," he said, "unless someone explains it to me?" So he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. ³² This is the passage of Scripture the eunuch was reading: "He was led like a sheep to the slaughter, and as a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he did not open his mouth. ³³ In his humiliation he was deprived of justice. Who can speak of his descendants? For his life was taken from the earth." ³⁴ The eunuch asked Philip, "Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?" ³⁵ Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶ As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water. What can stand in the way of my being baptized?" ³⁷ Philip said, "If you believe with all your heart, you may." The eunuch answered, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." ³⁸ And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch down into the water and Philip baptized him. ³⁹ When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord suddenly took Philip away, and the eunuch did not see him again, but went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰ Philip, however, appeared at Azotus and traveled about, preaching the gospel in all the towns until he reached Caesarea.

Acts 8:26-40

2) Praise the Lord because we can <u>OVERCOME</u> anything.

Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world. ² This is how you can recognize the Spirit of God: Every spirit that acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, ³ but every spirit that does not acknowledge Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming and even now is already in the world. ⁴ You, dear children, are from God and have overcome them, because the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world. ⁵ They are from the world and therefore speak from the viewpoint of the world, and the world listens to them. ⁶ We are from God, and whoever knows God listens to us; but whoever is not from God does not listen to us. This is how we recognize the Spirit of truth and the spirit of falsehood. ⁷ Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. ⁸ Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. ⁹ This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. ¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹ Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

3) Praise the Lord because we can <u>DO</u> everything.

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ²He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. ³You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. ⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. ⁷ If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

John 15:1-8
