"Think Possible"

August 25, 2024

Reading the two Scriptures: *'With God all things are possible' (v. 26). 'He did not many mighty works there because of their unbelief' (Matthew 13:58).* Those two verses mean this: many things that are possible remain undone because of doubt and unbelief. So, think *possible.*

If God's Word says you can succeed, but you're failing, it may mean this: you don't really believe what He says, or you're not willing to do your part. When you think *possible*, it increases your energy level. Who gets energized at the prospect of losing? If you know something can't succeed, how much time and energy are you willing to give it? Nobody goes looking for a lost cause. You only invest yourself in what you believe can succeed. So when you think *possible* and trust God for success, your faith becomes the energizing force.

Some people believe that possibility thinkers are naive or foolish. If you're one of them, answer this question: how many highly successful people do you know who are continually negative? How many impossibility thinkers are you acquainted with who achieve big things? None! The first step to thinking *possible* is to stop yourself from searching for and dwelling on what's wrong with each situation. People with an it-can't-be-done mindset have two choices: they can expect the worst and continually experience it, or change their thinking. And that begins with eliminating the negative self-talk you hear in your head before you have even opened your mouth. *'The tongue can bring death or life; those who love to talk will reap the consequences'.* In order to think possible, you must believe and speak *possible*.

PRAYER

Heavenly Father, help me say and believe each day that ALL things are possible with You! In Jesus' Name, Amen

The Bible says, *'Without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him' (v. 6).* Here is something God can't do: be pleased without faith!

Twelve spies entered the Promised Land, but only two came back and said, 'We are well able to overcome it'. God had promised it to them, but the majority thought it couldn't be done. People who think possible not only create forward-looking, optimistic pictures of the future in their own minds, but also in the minds of others. And the opposite is true, 'Nothing is so embarrassing as watching someone do something that you said couldn't be done.' Now, believing you can doesn't guarantee you will. But believing you can't guarantees you won't!

How's your approach to life? When you face the unknown, the undone, or the untried, do you focus on all the things that can go wrong or all the things that can go right? Wernher von Braun said, 'I have learned to use the word "impossible" with the greatest caution.' You say, 'Who was he?' The scientist who made it possible for the first man to walk on the moon! 'Never tell a young person that something cannot be done. God may have been waiting centuries for somebody ignorant enough of the impossible to do that very thing.' If you want to achieve something, give yourself permission to believe it is possible – and trust God for success.

Heavenly Father, having faith in You, help me think POSSIBLE and keep looking forward. In Jesus' Name, Amen

VERSE OF THE MONTH ²³ For life is more than food, and the body more than clothes. ²⁴ Consider the ravens: They do not sow or reap, they have no storeroom or barn; yet God feeds them. And how much more valuable you are than birds! ²⁵ Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to your life? ²⁶ Since you cannot do this very little thing, why do you worry about the rest? ²⁷ "Consider how the wild flowers grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. ²⁸ If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today, and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, how much more will he clothe you—you of little faith! ²⁹ And do not set your heart on what you will eat or drink; do not worry about it. ³⁰ For the pagan world runs after all such things, and your Father knows that you need them. ³¹ But seek his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well. ³² "Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom. ³³ Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will never fail, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. ³⁴ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

TWC thankful to serve families once again at its food pantry

Together We Cope is happy to welcome clients back to our food pantry following more than a year's closure after a fire. Staff has been providing groceries to our neighbors in crisis, with a major assist from the Greater Chicago Food Depository. Food is available Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and Thursday from 1 to 6 p.m. "The Food Depository has been extremely generous in supporting our reopening ef-

forts," said Kathryn Straniero, executive director. "Without them, we'd be struggling to get back in business."

Other funding from private foundations, businesses, and individuals was instrumental in getting the pantry up and running. Additionally, funding from a state grant is forthcoming after TWC was recommended for financial assistance.

Thousands of area residents rely on the TWC pantry to supplement their food budget, receiving a week's worth of groceries free once per month. "Being unable to serve our clients for more than 18 months has been the most painful part of this for me," said Tony Roman, food pantry manager. "The great news is they never stopped receiving assistance," he said, explaining that TWC worked with other food pantries in the region to service families in need. "I imagine families in need of greater assistance have definitely felt the impact of us being closed," Roman said. "Clients were forced to go out of their way in their times of need to obtain groceries, but TWC is getting back on track."

Straniero said the agency is fully aware of the hardship on families that the fire caused. "Typically, we serve 5,000 individuals a month in our pantry. We pride ourselves on providing the highest quality of food to our clients and treating them as we want to be treated. No one is turned away. We are ready and excited to bring clients back. Our volunteers and staff have missed them more than they've missed us."

'Make your plans as fantastic as you like, because twenty-five years from now they will seem mediocre. Make your plans ten times as great as you first planned, and twenty-five years from now you will wonder why you did not make them fifty times as great.' There is only one way to keep growing: make your goal a step beyond what makes you comfortable. That will force you to keep growing! And it will also set you up to believe God for greater things. Most people want their lives to keep improving, yet they value peace and stability at the same time. They forget that you can't improve and stay the same. "The Fool Says ... "

Psalm 14 says: "The fool says in his heart, 'There is no God ... ""

1) The fool says, "There is no Divine <u>SCROLL</u>."

¹¹ For you this whole vision is nothing but words sealed in a scroll. And if you give the scroll to someone who can read, and say, "Read this, please," they will answer, "I can't; it is sealed." ¹² Or if you give the scroll to someone who cannot read, and say, "Read this, please," they will answer, "I don't know how to read." ¹³ The Lord says: "These people come near to me with their mouth and honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. Their worship of me is based on merely human rules they have been taught. ¹⁴ Therefore once more I will astound these people with wonder upon wonder; the wisdom of the wise will perish, the intelligence of the intelligent will vanish." ¹⁵ Woe to those who go to great depths to hide their plans from the LORD, who do their work in darkness and think, "Who sees us? Who will know?" ¹⁶ You turn things upside down, as if the potter were thought to be like the clay! Shall what is formed say to the one who formed it, "You did not make me"? Can the pot say to the potter, "You know nothing"? ¹⁷ In a very short time, will not Lebanon be turned into a fertile field and the fertile field seem like a forest? ¹⁸ In that day the deaf will hear the words of the scroll, and out of gloom and darkness the eyes of the blind will see. ¹⁹ Once more the humble will rejoice in the LORD; the needy will rejoice in the Holy One of Israel. Isaiah 29:11-19

2) The fool says, "There is no Divine MYSTERY."

²²-Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands as you do to the Lord. ²³ For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. ²⁴ Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything. ²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her ²⁶ to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, ²⁷ and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless. ²⁸ In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹ After all, no one ever hated their own body, but they feed and care for their body, just as Christ does the church— ³⁰ for we are members of his body. ³¹ "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh." ³² This is a profound mystery—but I am talking about Christ and the church. ³³ However, each one of you also must love his wife as he loves himself, and the wife must respect her husband. Ephesians 5:22-33

3) The fool says, "There is no Divine <u>COMMAND</u>."

7 The Pharisees and some of the teachers of the law who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus ² and saw some of his disciples eating food with hands that were defiled, that is, unwashed. ³ (The Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they give their hands a ceremonial washing, holding to the tradition of the elders. ⁴ When they come from the marketplace they do not eat unless they wash. And they observe many other traditions, such as the washing of cups, pitchers and kettles.) ⁵ So the Pharisees and teachers of the law asked Jesus, "Why don't your disciples live according to the tradition of the elders instead of eating their food with defiled hands?" ⁶ He replied, "Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you hypocrites; as it is written: "These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. ⁷ They worship me in vain; their teachings are merely human rules.' ⁸ You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to human traditions." ⁹ And he continued, "You have a fine way of setting aside the commands of God in order to observe your own traditions! ¹⁰ For Moses said, 'Honor your father and mother,' and, 'Anyone who curses their father or mother is to be put to death.' ¹¹ But you say that if anyone declares that what might have been used to help their father or mother is Corban (that is, devoted to God)— ¹² then you no longer let them do anything for their father or mother. ¹³ Thus you nullify the word of God by your tradition that you have handed down. And you do many things like that." Mark 7:1-13
