"Learning to Listen to God"

Jesus told His disciples, 'I have much more to say to you, but right now it would be more than you could understand. The Spirit shows what is true and will come and guide you into the full truth' (vv. 12-13). Jesus spoke these words to men He had spent the previous three years with. Now, wouldn't you think if Jesus was with us in person, day and night for three years, we would have learned all there is to know? Not so. In fact, Jesus tells us to stay tuned, because He always has something to say to us about every new situation we face. But there are certain things He will only reveal to you when He knows you're ready to handle them.

God wants to speak to you on a one-to-one basis, to lead you step by step to the good things He has planned for you. He cares about the tiniest details of your life. So, never hesitate to take what you consider small things to Him, after all, everything is small to God! He cares about the desires of your heart. He wants to reveal truth to you that will set you free from fear and worry. His plan to share an intimate relationship with you was in place long before you were born. He 'marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands. God did this so that they would seek him' (Acts 17:26-27). Now think about it: if God planned your life in such minute detail before you were even born, isn't it important for you to learn how to listen to Him? **People think they** can't hear from God, when in reality, there are things they already know He wants them to respond to, and so far they haven't done it. The guicker you do whatever the Lord has already told you to do, the sooner He will reveal the next step to you. His promise is, 'If you willingly obey me, the best...will be yours.' Hearing from God is something you only develop with practice, especially if you're a talker! That's why He says, 'Be still, and know that I am God' (Psalm 46:10). Our flesh is full of energy; we always want to be doing something, and it can be difficult for us to be still. Don't just talk to God when you need something; spend time listening. He will open up many issues if you will just be still before Him. You say, 'I don't think I have ever heard God talk to me.' Maybe that's because you haven't learned to listen! When you ask God for something, tune your 'receiver'. Even if He doesn't respond at that very moment, rest assured He will in due time. You may be doing some ordinary task when He decides to speak to you. And if you have honored Him by learning to listen as you fellowship with Him, He will speak to you at exactly the right time. Perhaps you have spent years going your own way. If so, don't despair; it's not too late to change direction. If you're willing to obey God, He will guide you on the exciting journey of learning to hear from Him every day of your life.

When you pray diligently and believe you have heard from God, but then you start asking other people what they think, you're honoring their opinions above God's. That kind of mindset will prevent you from developing a relationship where you constantly hear from Him. You need to trust Him. If you have made bad decisions in the past, this can be difficult. But you must learn to listen to God without constantly needing reassurance from others. The Bible says: 'The anointing (the sacred appointment, the unction) which you received from Him abides [permanently] in you; [so]...you have no need that anyone should instruct you....His anointing teaches you concerning everything and is true ... so you must abide in (live in, never depart from) Him' That does not mean you don't need teaching and instruction when it comes to understanding God's Word; it means you have God's Spirit living inside you and that He will guide and direct you personally. You might have to ask somebody for advice from time to time, but you need not constantly go to other people and ask them about decisions you're making for your life. If you're ever going to develop the ability to listen to God and be led by His Spirit, you must start making your own decisions – and trust the wisdom God has deposited in your heart. The devil wants you to think you're not capable of hearing from God. Don't believe him. The Holy Spirit who dwells inside you will give you confidence, comfort, and counsel for your life. So, learn to listen to Him.

Lutheran Church Charities in Texas Hill

Lutheran Church Charities is planning to deploy to the Texas Hill Country this week to BE THERE to offer HOPE TO THE HURTING after catastrophic rains, rapid rises in river levels, and massive flash flooding overwhelmed multiple communities over the July 4 weekend, taking the lives of more than 100 people, including at least 28 children at campgrounds along the Guadalupe River basin.

Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod Texas District President Rev. Dr. Jon Braunersreuther and Texas District Disaster Response Coordinators Julie Tucker and David Ricks have invited LCC to lend Disaster Response expertise and bring K-9 Comfort Dog, Hearts of Mercy & Compassion ministries, and LCC Care Teams trained in Spiritual First Aid™ to the Texas Hill Country to provide physical, emotional, and spiritual care to those affected by the still-unfolding tragedy.

LCC volunteers in Texas and Oklahoma are standing by to mobilize and travel to affected areas.

Search and rescue operations continue with around-the-clock response from local, state, and national first responders. Hundreds of officers and support staff are working in Kerr County and the surrounding region.

LCC is calling on its supporters to pray for families and individuals affected, as well as LCC's preparations to serve the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) Texas District, plus working alongside LCMS pastors and congregations participating in community care efforts, including Kerrville, Boerne, San Antonio, and Houston. Also, please pray for weather conditions to allow for ongoing recovery efforts.

LCC President/CEO Rev. Chris Singer has been in communication with LCMS district officials, while the directors from all four LCC ministry areas are reaching out to pastors in the region, as well as LCC volunteers poised to help.

"The scope of this tragic disaster is large and so many families are facing the devastating reality of lost loved ones," Rev. Singer said. "Lives have been upended and torn apart. They need our prayers and our urgent help right now."

LCC is preparing to BE THERE with them, ready to offer emergency assistance, tangible support, and most importantly, the comfort and hope found only in Jesus Christ.

LCC can provide this assistance because of faithful, generous donors and volunteers who are willing to support and serve.

Your earnest prayers and kindhearted assistance are greatly appreciated by the many people overwhelmed by the trauma and pain, as well as those who are responding with help.

LCC makes visits with LCC K-9 Comfort Dog ministry teams, places hearts and crosses at memorials and vigil sites, and provides free disaster response assistance as a reminder to hurting communities that people across the nation love and support them. LCC seeks to provide those impacted by tragedy with opportunities to process their grief and receive messages of love and hope, ultimately finding solace in the peace of Jesus Christ.

Thanks to you, Lutheran Church Charities will BE THERE as long as necessary to provide the mercy, compassion, presence, and proclamation of Jesus Christ to those who are struggling, suffering, and in need.

"I Will See"

"I will see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living..."
Psalm 27:13

1) I see the PROMISE of the Lord.

The Lord appeared to Abraham near the great trees of Mamre while he was sitting at the entrance to his tent in the heat of the day. ² Abraham looked up and saw three men standing nearby. When he saw them, he hurried from the entrance of his tent to meet them and bowed low to the ground. ³ He said, "If I have found favor in your eyes, my lord, do not pass your servant by. ⁴ Let a little water be brought, and then you may all wash your feet and rest under this tree. ⁵ Let me get you something to eat, so you can be refreshed and then go on your way—now that you have come to your servant." "Very well," they answered, "do as you say." ⁶ So Abraham hurried into the tent to Sarah. "Quick," he said, "get three seahs of the finest flour and knead it and bake some bread." ⁷ Then he ran to the herd and selected a choice, tender calf and gave it to a servant, who hurried to prepare it. ⁸ He then brought some curds and milk and the calf that had been prepared, and set these before them. While they ate, he stood near them under a tree. ⁹ "Where is your wife Sarah?" they asked him. "There, in the tent," he said. ¹⁰ Then one of them said, "I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah your wife will have a son." Genesis 18:1-10a

2) I see the <u>PROCLAMATION</u> of the Lord.

Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. ²² But now he has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation— ²³ if you continue in your faith, established and firm, and do not move from the hope held out in the gospel. This is the gospel that you heard and that has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven, and of which I, Paul, have become a servant. ²⁴ Now I rejoice in what I am suffering for you, and I fill up in my flesh what is still lacking in regard to Christ's afflictions, for the sake of his body, which is the church. ²⁵ I have become its servant by the commission God gave me to present to you the word of God in its fullness— ²⁶ the mystery that has been kept hidden for ages and generations, but is now disclosed to the Lord's people. ²⁷ To them riches of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. ²⁸ He is the one we proclaim, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom, so that we may present everyone fully mature in Christ. ²⁹ To this end I strenuously contend with all the energy Christ so powerfully works in me.

3) I see the <u>PRIORITIES</u> of the Lord.

³⁸ As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, he came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to him. ³⁹ She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what he said. ⁴⁰ But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!" ⁴¹ "Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, ⁴² but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."
