"Lessons from Psalm 113"

1. Praise the Lord at All Times

Psalm 113 opens with a call to praise: "Hallelujah! Give praise, O servants of the LORD; praise the name of the LORD" (Psalm 113:1). This sets the tone for a life of continuous worship. Whether in times of joy or trial, praising God should be our default setting. It's a reminder that our focus should always be on His greatness, not our circumstances.

2. God's Name is Worthy of Praise

The psalmist emphasizes the importance of God's name: "Blessed be the name of the LORD both now and forevermore" (Psalm 113:2). This teaches us that God's name is not just a label but a representation of His character and deeds. By honoring His name, we acknowledge His eternal nature and unchanging goodness.

3. God's Glory is Above All

Psalm 113:4 declares, "The LORD is exalted over all the nations, His glory above the heavens." This verse reminds us that God's majesty surpasses all earthly powers and authorities.

In a world where we often get caught up in human achievements, it's crucial to remember

that God's glory is the ultimate standard.

4. God is Incomparable

"Who is like the LORD our God, the One enthroned on high?". This question highlights the uniqueness of God. There is no one like Him and nothing can compare to His power and majesty. This truth should fill us with awe and inspire us to live lives that reflect His greatness.

5. God Stoops to See Us

The psalmist beautifully illustrates God's humility: "He humbles Himself to behold the heavens and the earth" (Psalm 113:6). Despite His exalted position, God cares deeply about His creation. This is a powerful reminder that no matter how small or insignificant we may feel, God sees us and is intimately involved in our lives.

6. God Lifts the Lowly

"He raises the poor from the dust and lifts the needy from the ash heap" (Psalm 113:7). This verse speaks to God's heart for the marginalized and downtrodden. It's a call to trust in His ability to transform our circumstances and a challenge to reflect His compassion in our interactions with others.

7. God Grants Dignity

Verse 8 continues, "to seat them with nobles, with the princes of His people." God not only lifts us from our lowly positions but also grants us dignity and honor. This is a profound reminder of our worth in His eyes and an encouragement to live as His representatives on earth.

8. God Blesses the Barren

"He settles the barren woman in her home as a joyful mother of children". This verse highlights God's power to bring life and joy where there was once emptiness and sorrow. It's a testament to His ability to fulfill our deepest desires and a call to trust in His perfect timing.

9. God's Care is Personal

Throughout Psalm 113, we see a God who is not distant but deeply personal. He knows our struggles and meets us where we are. This personal care is a reminder that we are never alone, and we can always turn to Him for comfort and guidance.

10. Praise is Our Response

The psalm concludes as it began, with a call to praise: "Hallelujah!". Our response to God's greatness, compassion, and care should be one of continual praise. By living a life of worship, we align ourselves with His purposes and reflect His glory to the world around us.

DEVOTIONAL OF THE WEEK ²⁵ I do not want you to be ignorant of this mystery, brothers and sisters, so that you may not be conceited: Israel has experienced a hardening in part until the full number of the Gentiles has come in, ²⁶ and in this way all Israel will be saved. As it is written: "The deliverer will come from Zion; he will turn godlessness away from Jacob. ²⁷ And this is my covenant with them when I take away their sins." ²⁸ As far as the gospel is concerned, they are enemies for your sake; but as far as election is concerned, they are loved on account of the patriarchs, ²⁹ for God's gifts and his call are irrevocable. ³⁰ Just as you who were at one time disobedient to God have now received mercy as a result of their disobedience, ³¹ so they too have now become disobedient in order that they too may now receive mercy as a result of God's mercy to you. ³² For God has bound everyone over to disobedience so that he may have mercy on them all. ³³ Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable his judgments, and his paths beyond tracing out! ³⁴ "Who has known the mind of the Lord? Or who has been his counselor?" ³⁵ "Who has ever given to God, that God should repay them?" ³⁶ For from him and through him and for him are all things. To him be the glory forever! Amen.



"He Raises the Poor"

"He raises the poor from the dust..."
Psalm 113:7a

1) He raises the poor... God always REMEMBERS.

⁴ Hear this, you who trample the needy and do away with the poor of the land, ⁵ saying, "When will the New Moon be over that we may sell grain, and the Sabbath be ended that we may market wheat?"—skimping on the measure, boosting the price and cheating with dis-honest scales, ⁶ buying the poor with silver and the needy for a pair of sandals, selling even the sweepings with the wheat. ⁷ The LORD has sworn by himself, the Pride of Jacob: "I will never forget anything they have done.

Amos 8:4-7

2) He raises the poor... God wants all to be REDEEMED.

I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— ² for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. ³ This is good, and pleases God our Savior, ⁴ who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. ⁵ For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, ⁶ who gave himself as a ransom for all people. This has now been witnessed to at the proper time. ⁷ And for this purpose I was appointed a herald and an apostle—I am telling the truth, I am not lying—and a true and faithful teacher of the Gentiles. ⁸ Therefore I want the men everywhere to pray, lifting up holy hands without anger or disputing. ⁹ I also want the women to dress modestly, with decency and propriety, adorning themselves, not with elaborate hairstyles or gold or pearls or expensive clothes, ¹⁰ but with good deeds, appropriate for women who profess to worship God. ¹¹ A woman should learn in quietness and full submission. ¹² I do not permit a woman to teach or to assume authority over a man; she must be quiet. ¹³ For Adam was formed first, then Eve. ¹⁴ And Adam was not the one deceived; it was the woman who was deceived and became a sinner. ¹⁵ But women will be saved through childbearing—if they continue in faith, love and holiness with propriety.

3) He raises the poor... God gives us all His RICHES.

Jesus told his disciples: "There was a rich man whose manager was accused of wasting his possessions. ² So he called him in and asked him, 'What is this I hear about you? Give an account of your management, because you cannot be manager any longer.' ³ "The manager said to himself, 'What shall I do now? My master is taking away my job. I'm not strong enough to dig, and I'm ashamed to beg— ⁴ I know what I'll do so that, when I lose my job here, people will welcome me into their houses.' ⁵ "So he called in each one of his master's debtors. He asked the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' ⁶ "Nine hundred gallons of olive oil,' he replied. "The manager told him, 'Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it four hundred and fifty.' ⁷ "Then he asked the second, 'And how much do you owe?' "A thousand bushels of wheat,' he replied. "He told him, 'Take your bill and make it eight hundred.' ⁸ "The master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly. For the people of this world are more shrewd in dealing with their own kind than are the people of the light. ⁹ I tell you, use worldly wealth to gain friends for yourselves, so that when it is gone, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. ¹⁰ "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with were little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much. ¹¹ So if you have not been trustworthy in handling worldly wealth, who will give you property of your own? ¹³ "No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money." ¹⁴ The Pharisees, who loved money, heard all this and were sneering at Jesus. ¹⁵ He said to them, "You are the ones who justify yourselves in the eyes of others, but God knows your hearts. What people value highly is detestable in God's sight.
